Neighborhood Meeting Summary

A neighborhood meeting was held on Wednesday, December 22, 2022, beginning at 6:30 p.m. at 940 S. 6th Street, Louisville, KY. Those in attendance included the applicant/owner's representative, Christian Miller, attorney with Bardenwerper, Talbott & Roberts, and the applicant/owner Jonathan Pacilio. The applicant/owner's interior decorator was also available for any design questions.

There were six neighbors in attendance, and all gathered around the kitchen for the meeting. Christian started out by distributing to each person a printed version of a PowerPoint presentation of the property, its location, current zoning, use, and proposed use. Christian discussed the PowerPoint presentation. During that discussion, Christian showed the extensive restoration that had occurred at this property and explained the proposed use as a short-term rental. Due to the number of attendees, questions were taken throughout the discussion of the PowerPoint presentation and continued after the presentation had concluded.

There were many questions related to the potential impacts short-term rentals in general may have upon the area. Neighbors asked questions and discussed the potential effects short-term rentals may have upon long-term rents, property values, census data, Metro Council districts, the Limerick and Old Louisville neighborhoods, and local businesses.

There were some questions relating specifically to this use: management; maintenance; and parking. The applicant/owner shared that he had local management and maintenance persons he intended on using, and that the parking pad off of the alley provided between three and five parking spaces for renters.

Those in attendance were provided contact information for the law firm representing the applicant/owner for any follow-up questions. Some stayed after people began leaving in order to speak with the applicant/owner and his representative individually. The meeting ended around 8:00 p.m.


