She has been the recipient of many awards and acknowledgements from mayors, governors, President Obama, NAACP, and others. She has worked with past aldermen such as Paul Bather, always around to lend a helping hand. It's time to honor her with an honorary street naming.~~

Greg Allen - Mr. Allen is retiring from the United States Postal Services after 40+ years. Mr. Allen has been a faithful and diligent mailman, often seen delivering mail in the dark up to 10:00 at night! I asked him why would he work so late when he didn't have to, his response was, "somebody has to get the mail out to the residents."
