# BOYD Cecil Avenue Location History

- ☑ 1913Roy C Whayne Supply Company was established and located at the southwest corner of Jefferson and Center Streets in downtown Louisville, Kentucky.
- 1956 Whayne Supply Company purchased the former Kentucky State Fairgrounds property on Cecil Avenue, Louisville, Kentucky and relocated to this property.
- Over the years additional buildings were added and part of the property became utilized for Foster Traditional JCPS Elementary School.
- In 2008, Monty Boyd, current president and long tenured employee (38 years) purchased Whayne Supply Company and in 2020 the name was formally changed to Boyd Company.
- ☑ 2022 The original Merchants & Manufacturers Building built in 1921 still stands on the Cecil Avenue property along with several buildings to accommodate Boyd Company Sales Offices, Service Shops, Rental Operations, Parts Warehouse, and Boyd Truck Center operations.

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## Louisville Logistics Park

The Louisville Logistics Park is not being authorized by or has and do with the legislation recently passed called the "West End TIF." This incentive is being authorized under totally separate authority via KRS (hapter 103 which has been around since the 1940's. The "West End TIF" was passed in 2021 and can be found in KRS 65.500 et seq.



# Project Specifics



#### IRB - Industrial Revenue Bond

Statutorily authorized incentive resulting in tax abatement to project - similar to a TIF. City is not responsible for any debt and is merely a conduit.

An IRB must go through Metro Council twice. The first trip is for the passage of the Inducement Resolution which describes the process and the specifics of the project. R -14-22 (the Inducement Resolution) sponsored by CW Green, CM Piagentini, CM Hollander, and President James was adopted by the Metro Council 24 -0 at the February 3, 2022 Council Meeting. The purpose of the Ordinance before you now is to merely approve the specific bond documents needed to effectuate the IRB. No aspect of the project related to Metro has changed from the earlier legislation



#### Incentive is Capped

Incentive is capped at \$10,847,480 representing 80% of the estimated County and USD tax revenues (over 20 years) generated from the project.



#### PILOT

Company will enter into a PILOT which shall include the payment of taxes to JCPS and others.



#### L.M.C.O. 37.75

Project will also honor the goals of L.M.C.O. 37.75 regarding local, female and minority participation.
