I wish to draw your attention to Louisville Zoning and Planning Commission Case 21-MPLAT-0150 and 22-RSUB-0008 currently in active development and under continuing review, respectively.

The planned subdivision is being built at the site of the WHAS transmitter at 1312 Flat Rock Rd. The plan calls for the destruction of the 1938 Art Decco building. I believe that this building and its current contents are of significant cultural value and may merit protection and preservation. The building was home to the original radio and tv studios of WHAS and, at last report, still has the legacy transmission equipment intact.
