- There was a discussion regarding implementation of the recommendations made from the Hillard Heintz Report.

- There was a discussion regarding updates made to several domains within the Louisville Metro Police Department. The following areas of transparency were discussed - Data Analysis, Records Management System, Kentucky Operations, Use of Force and De-escalation, the Performance Review Board and Peer Review Process, Defensive Tactics Training, Complaints Against Louisville Metro Police Personnel (creating an online complaint form), installing a Louisville Metro Police Review Board, giving greater emphasis to Community Oriented Policing, installing a Civilian Review Board.

- There were several questions regarding how to encourage veteran officers and police leadership to change/reverse the previous police culture of the department.

- There were several questions regarding the proposed plan to ensure buy-in from veteran officers and police leadership.

- There were several questions regarding whether a contract had been secured to forensically examine the software system to determine whether Internal Affairs investigations had been compromised.

- There were several questions regarding what recruitment improvements/efforts have been made.

- There were several questions regarding equipment improvements.

- There was a discussion regarding the overall intent of the legislation to show the link between animal abuse and domestic violence.

- There was a discussion regarding the proposed training and reporting processes for the Louisville Metro Police Department, Louisville Metro Animal Services, and other agencies.

- There were several questions regarding a specific training curriculum to implement that would be in line with this legislation.

- There were several questions regarding whether this training component would be in addition to the regular training schedule.

- There were several questions regarding whether this training would impact the agency's budget.

- There were several questions regarding the time allotted for the training program, whether four, six, or eight additional hours of training.

- There was a discussion regarding the proposed risk assessment process that will be implemented based on the legislation.

- There were several questions regarding what would trigger/prompt the reporting process and/or investigation.

- There were several questions regarding whether the training schedule is annual or semiannual.

- There were several questions regarding the timeline for risk assessments and training certification.

Council President James proffered an amendment under "Training Requirements" to add a section stating that, the Louisville Metro Police Department and Louisville Metro Animal Services shall have one year after passage of this Ordinance to implement the training course(s).

A motion was made by Chair Person Green, seconded by Committee Member George, that this Ordinance be amended.

The motion to amend carried by a voice vote.

- There were several questions regarding whether the Louisville Metro Police Department currently has an assessment tool to use in instances of interpersonal violence.

- There was a discussion regarding the definition of interpersonal violence.

There were several questions regarding whether Louisville Metro Animal Services currently has an assessment tool to use in instances of animal abuse.
There were several questions regarding the definition or designation of animal abuse in the presence of a minor as opposed to an adult.

- There was a discussion regarding similar legislation in peer cities that also use the designation of animal abuse in the presence of a minor.

- There were several questions regarding whether these agencies are mandatory reporting agencies.

A motion was made by Committee Member Flood, seconded by Vice Chair Peden, that this Ordinance be tabled.

Without objection, the Ordinance was tabled.
