



In addition, I left you a voice mail in regards to face painting for the youth. Thank you for your time and hopefully we can resolve this today.

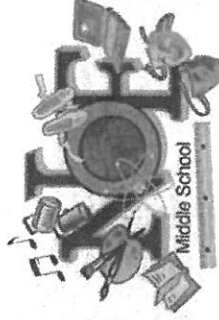

Samuel Moore began his love affair with basketball while attending Madison Junior High School in Louisville. A quick study, Moore learned the basics and was on the fast track to stardom. He enrolled at Central High School and from 1950-52, led the team to two Kentucky High School Athletic League state championships and one runner-up finish during his three years. Moore was named the state tournament's most valuable player each year and also earned all-district, all-regional and all-state honors during his three-year run. In 1952, Moore led the Yellowjackets to the National Negro League championship under legendary coach William Kean. He was also selected as the most valuable player in the first integrated games played in the state when Central played Flaget and St. Xavier. After graduation, Moore attended Tennessee State University where he lettered all four years and led the Tigers to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) title, a first for a team with African-American athletes. After graduating college, Moore went on to star professionally with the Harlem Globetrotters and Harlem Magicians. (Adapted from the 2010 KHSSA Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony)

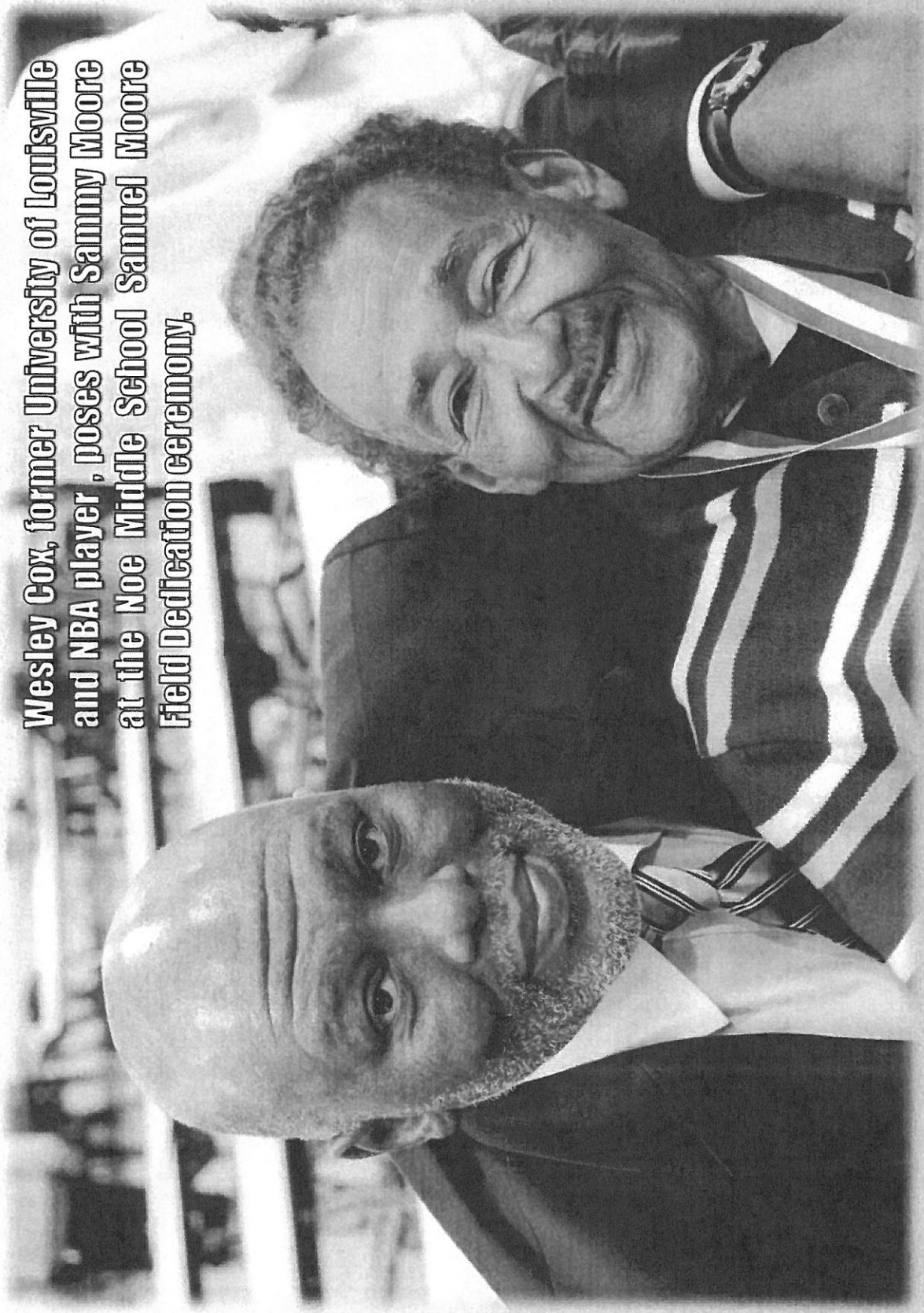
- Led Central High School to three State Championships, 1950, 51, 52
- Led Central High School to Negro National Championship in 1962
- Led State in scoring 1951-52, with 24 points per game, 38-3 win/lost record
- Named All-District, All-Region and All-State for all three years
- Voted MVP in KHSAL State Tournament, two years
- Selected MVP in first integrated basketball games in state between Central and Flaget and St. Xavier
- Lettered 4 years at Tennessee State University (TSU), 1953-56
- TSU team won N.A.I.A. National Title (first minority team)
- Played professionally for Harlem Globetrotters and Harlem Magicians
- First Central High School Player to have Jersey retired
- Coached Basketball at Lincoln Institute, Manly Jr. High School and Noe Middle School
- Taught school for 45 years; 33 years as P.E. Teacher (retired in 2007)
- Recreation Supervisor at Southwick Community Center for 45+ years

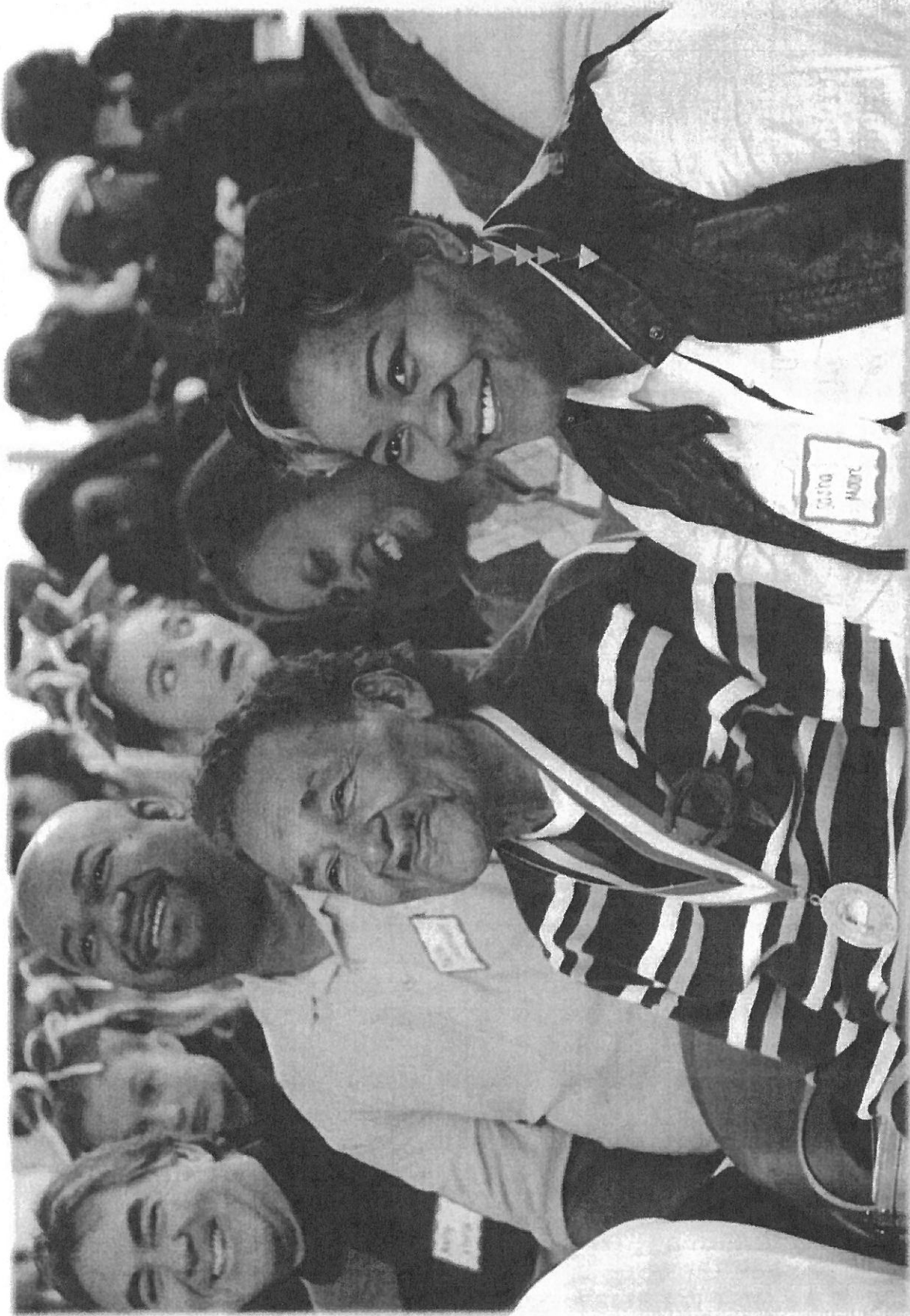

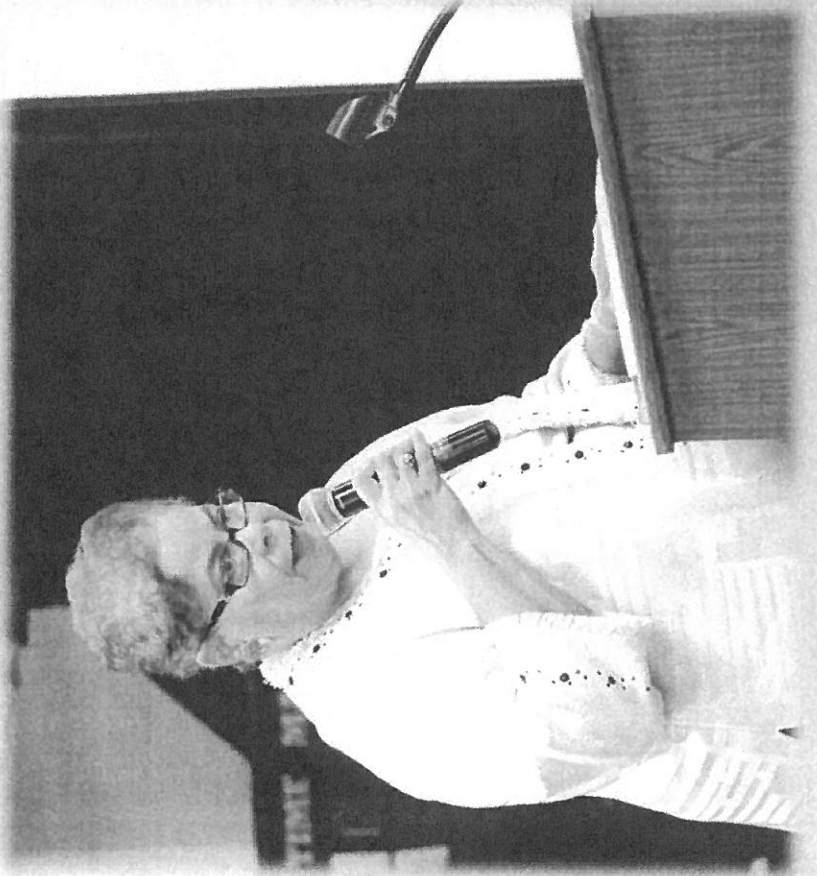

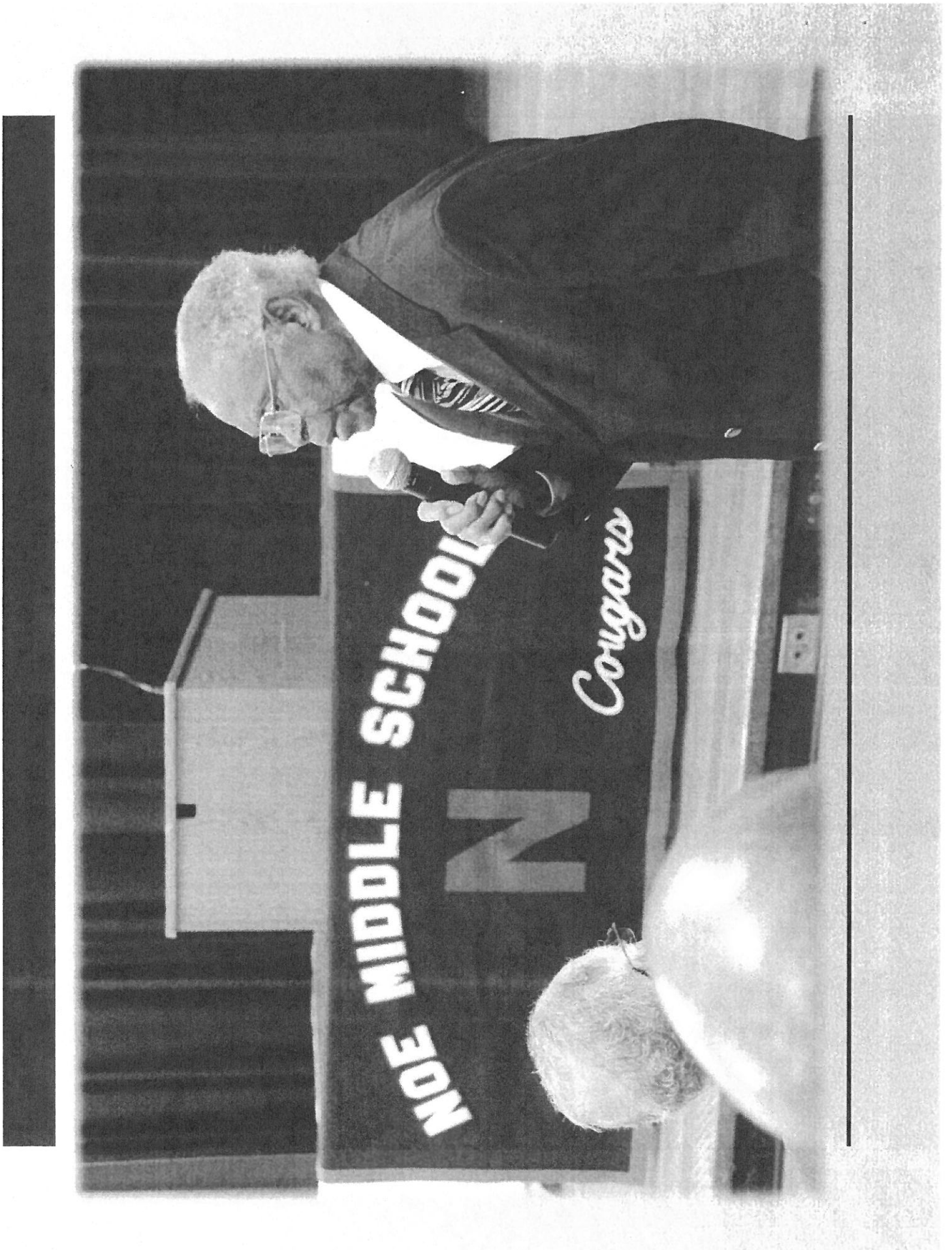
