

Jeff, Matthew –

Four items.

Jeff, at our Town Hall meeting earlier this year, you spoke about Hikes Lane and that this would finally be the year the work begins. According to the map we received, the work is scheduled for Furman Boulevard eastward in FY19, which is over. Is there a timeline for Hikes Lane to begin? Our design for repairs is complete and we plan to send our bid documents for the section of Hikes between Taylorsville and Furman to purchasing within the next month. Advertisement and contract award (assuming the costs are close to our estimate) will likely take 4-6 weeks so we would be looking at beginning work in October which and roadway work will likely extend into Spring 2019.

We've complained for years about the curbing on the northeast corner of Hikes and Furman. It was repaired in 2012 and again in 2016 but neither job has held. It is currently all crumbled and I moved a chunk of broken concrete out of the corner over the weekend. Will this be corrected and/or rebuilt as part of the Hikes Lane job? I have an email from Matthew from May 25, 2018 addressing the problem. It is back to being a problem as cars cut the corner too tight and spread broken concrete and rocks into the intersection. Sidewalk ramps will be updated at this corner as part of the roadway work for Hikes Ln. We may look to add some reinforcing steel into the concrete curbs at this location to provide some additional strength, but that will be assessed as work progresses.

Jeff, you also mentioned at the meeting, and also here in meetings, that the paving of Klondike Lane would begin soon. Is it on a schedule at this point? I do not have schedule yet, but do know that Hall Contracting plans to pave it this summer/fall. I have estimated 20+ sidewalk ramps to be updated with this paving work, so once everyone starts seeing that work progress, the paving should be following completion.

Finally, we'd like to get an estimate for the paving of Bashford Manor Lane from Bardstown Road to Medford Lane. I am estimating about \$42,000.00.
