DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY PERMIT

Permittee: Faulkner Real Estate Corporation

NOTE: The term "you" and its derivatives, as used in this permit, means the permittee or any future transferee. The term "this office" refers to the appropriate district or division office of the Corps of Engineers having jurisdiction over the permitted activity or the appropriate official acting under the authority of the commanding officer.

You are authorized to perform work in accordance with the terms and conditions specified below.

Project Description: The permittee is authorized to fill 10.435 acres of palustrine forested wetlands located on the property at Jefferson Boulevard and McCawley Road in order to construct a multi-family residential and commercial development and associated roads and infrastructure in accordance with the attached plans. Mitigation shall be a combination of 20 acres of palustrine forested wetlands reestablished onsite and the purchase of 7.5 wetland credits from an approved mitigation bank.

Project Location: Wetlands adjacent to the Slop Ditch, Southern Ditch watershed in the Jefferson Boulevard Development; 1255 McCawley Road, Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky

Permit Conditions:

General Conditions:

1. The time limit for completing the authorized activity ends on **June 30, 2024**. If you find that you need more time to complete the authorized activity, submit your request for a time extension to this office for consideration at least one month before the above date is reached.
2. You must maintain the activity authorized by this permit in good condition and in conformance with the terms and conditions of this permit. You are not relieved of this requirement if you abandon the permitted activity, although you may make a good faith transfer to a third party in compliance with General Condition 4 below. Should you wish to cease to maintain the authorized activity or should you desire to abandon it without a good faith transfer, you must obtain a modification from this permit from this office, which may require restoration of the area.
3. If you discover any previously unknown historic or archeological remains while accomplishing the activity authorized by this permit, you must immediately notify this office of what you have found. We will initiate the Federal and state coordination required to determine if the remains warrant a recovery effort or if the site is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.
4. If you sell the property associated with this permit, you must obtain the signature of the new owner in the space provided and forward a copy of the permit to this office to validate the transfer of this authorization.
5. If a conditioned water quality certification has been issued for your project, you must comply with the conditions specified in the certification as special conditions to this permit. For your convenience, a copy of the certification is attached if it contains such conditions.
6. You must allow representatives from this office to inspect the authorized activity at any time deemed necessary to ensure that it is being or has been accomplished with the terms and conditions of your permit.

Special Conditions:

1. The permittee shall reestablish onsite 20 acres of palustrine forested wetlands to compensate at a 3:1 ratio for impacts to 6.67 acres of palustrine forested wetlands. Mitigation and monitoring shall be conducted in accordance with the Mitigation Plan entitled "Wetland Mitigation Plan, Jefferson Boulevard Mitigation Site, Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky" dated July 2013, and revised April 28, 2014, by Redwing Ecological Services, Incorporated. Monitoring shall be conducted for a period of five years following completion of all construction and planting. Reports shall be submitted to the District Engineer annually by December 31 of each monitoring year.

2. The permittee shall also provide a receipt to the District Engineer from an approved wetland mitigation bank for the purchase of 7.5 Adjusted Mitigation Units (AMUs) to compensate at a 2:1 ratio for impacts to 3.77 acres of palustrine forested wetlands. **AMUs must be purchased prior to the discharge of fill material into "waters of the U.S."**
3. The permittee shall install erosion control measures to prevent disturbed sediments from impacting areas downstream. These measures shall be installed in all areas of construction susceptible to erosion and be maintained throughout construction.
4. Upon completion of the work authorized by this permit, the permittee shall revegetate all cleared areas with suitable ground cover-type grasses (such as wheat, rye, etc.).
5. The permittee shall submit for review and approval the deed restriction instrument for the established onsite wetland mitigation area prior to recording with the Jefferson County Clerk.

Further Information:

1. Congressional Authorities. You have been authorized to undertake the activity described above pursuant to:
 - () Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. 403).
 - (X) Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1344).
 - () Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 U.S.C. 1413).
2. Limits of this authorization.
 - a. This permit does not obviate the need to obtain other Federal, state, or local authorizations required by law.
 - b. This permit does not grant any property rights or exclusive privileges.
 - c. This permit does not authorize any injury to the property or rights of others.
 - d. This permit does not authorize interference with any existing or proposed Federal project.
3. Limits of Federal Liability. In issuing this permit, the Federal Government does not assume any liability for the following:
 - a. Damages to the permitted project or uses thereof as a result of other permitted or unpermitted activities or from natural causes.
 - b. Damages to the permitted project or uses thereof as a result of current or future activities undertaken by or on behalf of the United States in the public interest.
 - c. Damages to persons, property, or to other permitted or unpermitted activities or structures caused by the activity authorized by this permit.
 - d. Design or construction deficiencies associated with the permitted work.
 - e. Damage claims associated with any future modification, suspension, or revocation of this permit.
4. Reliance on Applicant's Data. The determination of this office that issuance of this permit is not contrary to the public interest was made in reliance on the information you provided.
5. Reevaluation of Permit Decision. This office may reevaluate its decision on this permit at any time the circumstances warrant. Circumstances that could require a reevaluation include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. You fail to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit.

b. The information provided by you in support of your permit application proves to have been false, incomplete, or inaccurate (See 4 above).

c. Significant new information surfaces which this office did not consider in reaching the original public interest decision.

Such a reevaluation may result in a determination that it is appropriate to use the suspension, modification, and revocation procedures contained in 33 CFR 325.7 or enforcement procedures such as those contained in 33 CFR 326.4 and 326.5. The referenced enforcement procedures provide for the issuance of an administrative order requiring you to comply with the terms and conditions of your permit and for the initiation of legal action where appropriate. You will be required to pay for any corrective measure ordered by this office, and if you fail to comply with such directive, this office may in certain situations (such as those specified in 33 CFR 209.170) accomplish the corrective measures by contract or otherwise and bill you for the cost.

6. Extensions. General condition 1 establishes a time limit for the completion of the activity authorized by this permit. Unless there are circumstances requiring either a prompt completion of the authorized activity or a reevaluation of the public interest decision, the Corps will normally give you favorable consideration to a request for an extension of this time limit. Your signature below, as permittee, indicates that you accept and agree to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit.

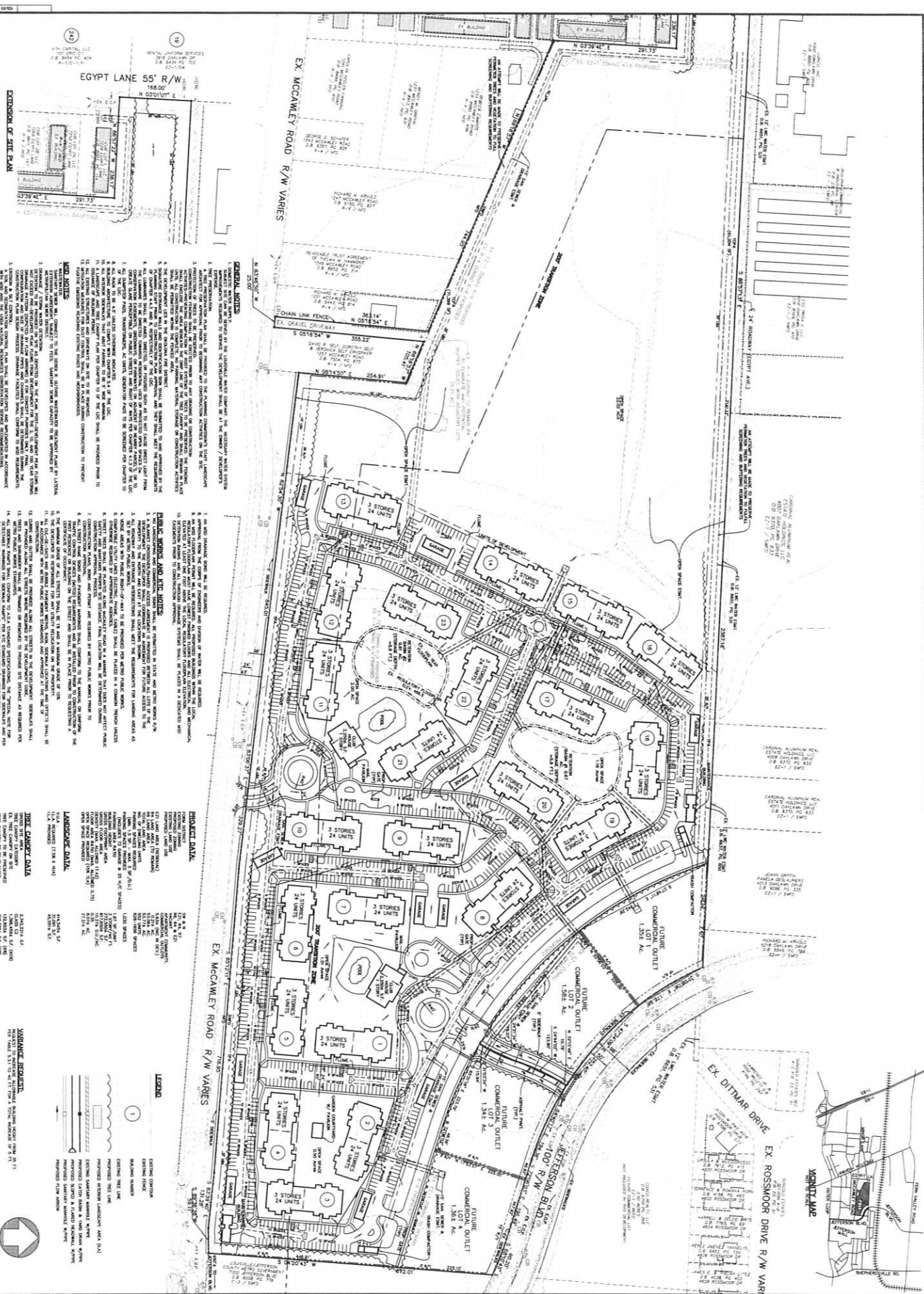

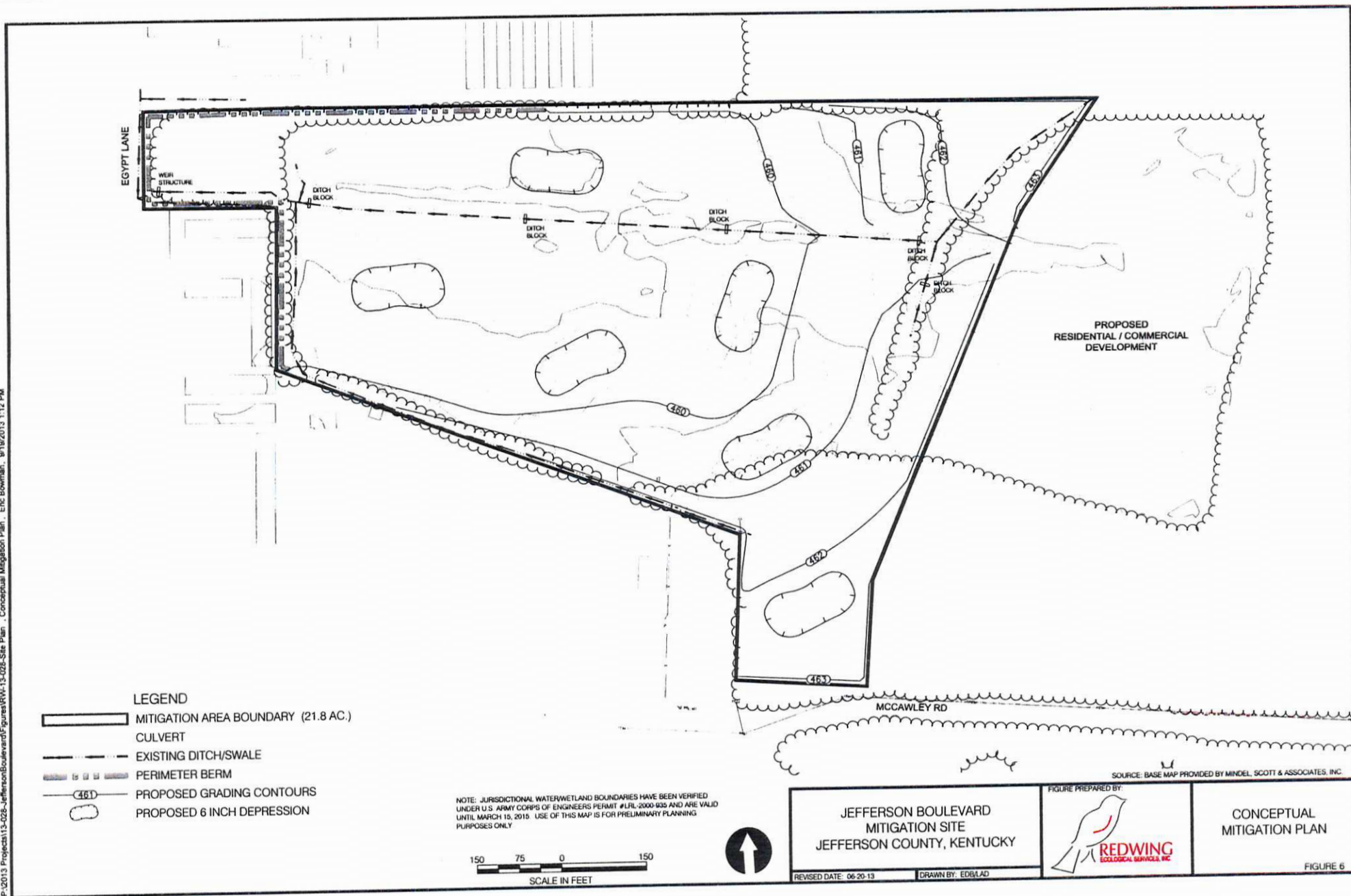
