



# Americana Community Center

*'Where Louisville Meets the World'*

The Americana Community Center is a non-profit organization, which provides a spectrum of services for the refugee, immigrant, and low-income residents of Metro Louisville. These educational services enable people to discover and utilize resources to build strong families, create a safe, supportive community and realize their individual potential.

From July 2014 to June 2015, more than **5,000** refugees, immigrants, and low-income individuals, representing **99** countries and **37** zip codes in **Louisville**, came through Americana's doors last year for the services Americana or our partners provide.



Since July 2015, **205** students enrolled in the **After School Program** and **55** families, including **66** adults and **78** children, in the **Family Education Program**. Every year, this number continues to grow while we strive to lower the number of hopeful participants on the waiting list.

Last fiscal year, **24** families achieved **54** goals through the **Family Coaching program**. These goals included purchasing a home, transitioning from ESL to GED program, enrolling their children in the school of their choice, and acquiring health insurance.

Our middle and high school students attending After School Program at least 3 out of 4 days a week currently have a **3.3 GPA average** and a **98.0% attendance rate** while the total average is less than 94%.

**385** youth were served in the After School and Summer Program. 95% of the children enrolled are refugees or immigrants.



**91** sessions were held for **community mental health counseling** through our partnership with the Spalding University Doctorate of Psychology Program.

**1269** participants enrolled in Adult Basic Education classes, including **GED** and **ESL** classes.

**6 out of 6** of our **graduating seniors** last year have been accepted to college! That continues our **4-year stretch** of having **100%** of our **graduating seniors** move on to post-secondary education.

**11,542** meals were served through Dare to Care's Kids Café to all of our participants 18 and younger.



**12** families are beginning to take care of their garden plots in the **Community Garden**, and these families represent **6** different countries. The garden has plans to expand for those waiting to grow their own produce!
