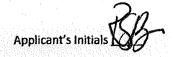

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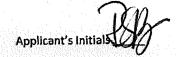


SECTION 3 - AGENCY DETAILS

Describe Agency's Vision, Mission and Services:

The purpose and mission of our organization is to serve as an advocate for maintaining Crescent Hill's quality of life by improving the civic, recreational, cultural and educational life of the Crescent Hill neighborhood and by strengthening community pride and involvement through objective planning, preservation, and enhancement of its historic character and natural beauty. Furthermore our organization helps inform neighborhood residents, resolve neighborhood issues, serves as a liaison between the neighborhood and Metro Government, working closely with Metro Government to serve the community in a variety of ways. Currently we mow and maintain medians, small parks and right of ways in the neighborhood, we have spearheaded the redesign and revitalization of Kennedy Court Park, and have raised or donated money to provide for the Family Resource Center at Field Elementary, the after school program at UCHM, projects at Barrett Middle School and the Crescent Hill Library (LFPL). We currently host the Crescent Hill Art & Music Festival, Easter Egg Hunt at the PD House, and the Crescent Hill Outdoor Cinema.

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SECTION 4 - PROGRAM/PROJECT NARRATIVE

A: Describe the program/project start and end dates, a description of the program/project and applicable data with regards to specific client population the program will address (attach related flyers, planning minutes, designs, event permits, proposals for services/goods, etc.):

This event is our main fund raising opportunity each year, and will occur on July 4th and 5th this year. It allows us bring the neighborhood together directly through the event itself as well as through volunteer opportunities. We use this opportunity to recruit volunteers from other neighborhood and business organizations, as well as residents of Crescent Hill. In this way we provide a platform for active community members to network outside of Crescent Hill and for new residents to get involved. We also do a wrap up Volunteer Picnic which allows everyone the opportunity to get together and enjoy each others' company.

We usually measure success in terms of 1) volunteer participation, 2) repeat vendors, sponsors, and volunteers, 3) comments by patrons and attendees, 4) how many people use the offered free parking and Trolley, and 5) our ability to give back financially to our community.

- B: Describe specifically how the funding will be spent including identification of funding to sub grantee(s): Funding of \$4,000 will be used to offset expenses for the event that are incurred for site related expenditures (estimated to total \$\$6,500) as follows:
- \$2,000 toward the lighting and sound equipment and associated personnel at the Crescent Hill Art & Music Festival (CHAMF) [Total cost estimated to be \$3,500]
- \$2,000 for picnic tables, seating, and sanitation facilities for attendees and participants. [Total cost estimated to be \$3,500]

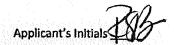

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C: If this request is a fundraiser, please detail how the proceeds will be spent: Historically we have spent proceeds on a number of community projects. For example a donation of \$5000 for stabilization work on the foundation of the historic Peterson-Dumesnil House, \$5000 toward the restoration of Kennedy Court Park, \$1000 annual donation to the UCHM Santa Sprint, as well as donations to Field Elementary, restoration of the TARC bus stop at Brownsboro and Jarvis, new banners along Frankfort Avenue, UCHM, and regular maintenance of Kennedy Court Park, Eastover Park, and the Hite Avenue median. Because the proceeds have varied greatly over the years, we do not forecast dollar amount expenditures of event proceeds. But as a rule we target 15% of current expenditures to cover increasing costs for next year's event and loss of corporate sponsors. The remaining funds will be allocated according to the consensus of the Board, but we anticipate spending proceeds in a way similar to previous years when proceeds were realized (we have had years where we did not make any money, it somewhat depends on the weather).

We offer music, art, food, tours and activities featuring the Peterson-Dumesnil House
and neighborhood history, activities for Children and promotion of Community organizations. Other local institutions participate in and/or have a presence at our event including the Frankfort Avenue Business Association, Field Elementary School, United Crescent Hill Ministries, St. Joseph's Children's Home, Masonic Homes of Kentucky, and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. We also have volunteers from other neighborhood organizations helping out, such as members of the Clifton Neighborhood Association, and work at times with other experienced associations in planning from Cherokee Triangle and Ursuline for example).

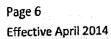

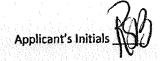

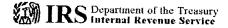

In connection with these purposes, the corporation may make distributions to organizations who Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

ARTICLE VI

The corporation shall neither have capital stock nor stockholders and notwithstanding any other provisions nerein, no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Three hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE VII

The corporation is not a private foundation, but in the event that the Internal Revenue Service deems it a private foundation as defined in Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, then the corporation shall comply with the requirements of Kentucky Revised Statutes 273.400 as well as related Internal Revenue Code provisions.
