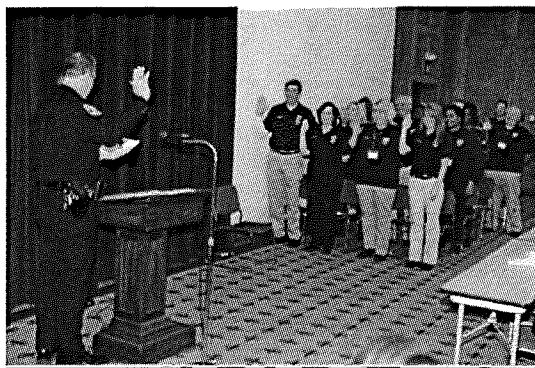

The Louisville Metro Police Department has prepared a comprehensive training program to provide Citizens Police Academy participants with an overview of the various divisions, units, and functions of the police department.

The LMPD Citizens Police Academy attendees will cover a wide variety of subjects including, but not limited to:

Tour of Headquarters, Live Fire and Taser Demonstrations, Firearms Automated Training Systems, Homicide, Crime Scene Processing, Mounted Patrol, SWAT, Narcotics, Vice, Criminal Law, Laws of Arrest, Search and Seizure, Emergency Vehicle Familiarity, Crimes Against Children, Domestic Violence, Tour of the Louisville Metro Department of Corrections and an opportunity to schedule a ride-along with a patrol officer and much, much more.



WEBSITE

In 2005, a web site was launched to provide interested citizens with current information regarding the Citizens Police Academy. ACADEMY INFORMATION

Citizens Police Academy classes are held twice a year and begin in February and September. Classes are twelve weeks in duration and meet on Tuesday nights from 7:00 PM – 9:30 PM.

Latino Citizens Police Academy is currently offered once a year. This program is offered in Spanish.

International Citizens Police Academy is offered to community leaders with the expectation of them returning to the international citizenship and sharing the knowledge they learned.

Youth Academy classes are offered during the summer months. This academy is offered to youth between the ages of 14-17 and is a one week program. The academy focuses on teaching discipline, team building and leadership. The academy is very interactive with an opportunity for youth to learn about the police department with a "behind the scenes" look. As a structured program, the youth wear uniforms and participate in daily exercise.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing Academy is offered every two years. This academy is geared to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community. We have interpreters who help facilitate this program.

Women's Citizens Police Academy is offered every other year. It is for women only and we also offer a self-defense/awareness class during the academy.

College Citizens Police Academy is geared to College students who are interested in the field of Law Enforcement. Some colleges give credit for taking this academy. Please check with your school.

Senior Citizens Police Academy is offered once a year to any person over the age of 55. This is an eight week academy during the hours of 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM. This academy offers seniors an understanding of crime prevention strategies, technology and the opportunity to become crime prevention practitioners in our community.
