Responsibility

- ❑ Should such person fail to maintain, repair, or reconstruct any such surface within ten days after written notice from the Director, LMPW may have such surface repaired or reconstructed and charge the cost of repair, including any costs associated with the use of any like materials used in restoration, to the person responsible therefor.



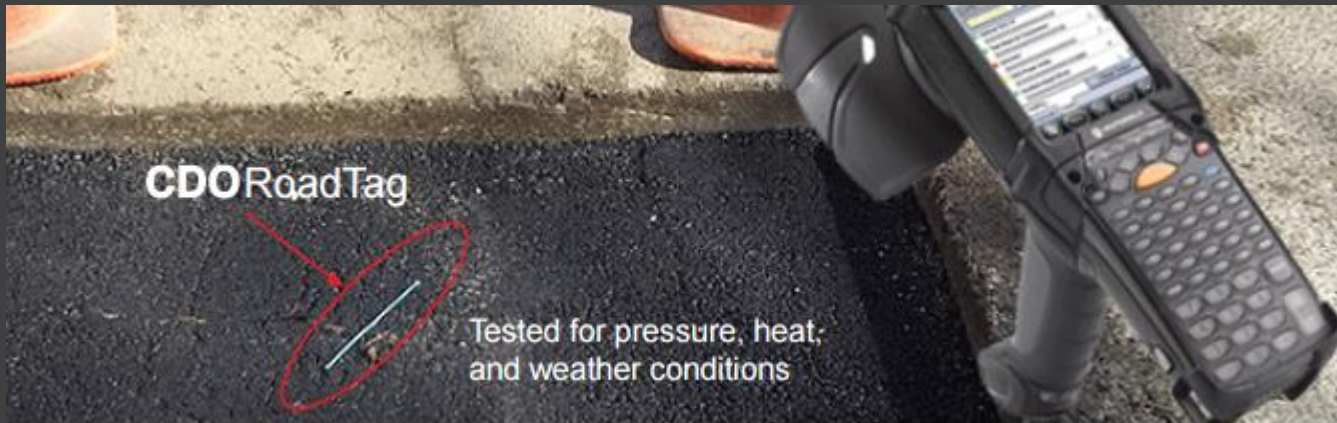
Radio Frequency Identification (RFID)
