N. <u>AWARD CLOSEOUT</u>. Within 90 days after expiration or notice of termination the parties shall close out the award/agreement.

Any unobligated balance of cash advanced to LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT must be immediately refunded to the U.S. Forest Service, including any interest earned in accordance with 7CFR 3016.21/2CFR 215.22.

Within a maximum of 90 days following the date of expiration or termination of this

grant, all financial performance and related reports required by the terms of the agreement must be submitted to the U.S. Forest Service by LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT.

If this agreement is closed out without audit, the U.S. Forest Service reserves the right to disallow and recover an appropriate amount after fully considering any recommended disallowances resulting from an audit which may be conducted later.

O. <u>PROGRAM PERFORMANCE REPORTS</u>. The parties to this agreement shall monitor the performance of the grant activities to ensure that performance goals are being achieved.

Performance reports shall contain information on the following:

- A comparison of actual accomplishments to the goals established for the period. Where the output of the project can be readily expressed in numbers, a computation of the cost per unit of output, if applicable,
- Reason(s) for delay if established goals were not met.
- Additional pertinent information,

LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT shall submit annual performance reports. These reports are due 30 days after the reporting period. These reports are due 30 days after the reporting period ending December 31.

The final performance report shall be submitted either with LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT's final payment request, or separately, but not later than 90 days from the expiration date of the grant.

- P. <u>NOTIFICATION</u>. LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT shall immediately notify the U.S. Forest Service of developments that have a significant impact on the activities supported under this award. Also, notification must be given in case of problems, delays or adverse conditions that materially impair the ability to meet the objectives of the award. - U. <u>FUNDING EQUIPMENT</u>. Federal funding under this award is not available for reimbursement of LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT's purchase of equipment and supplies. Equipment is defined as having a fair market value of \$5,000 or more per unit and a useful life of over one year. Supplies are those items that are not equipment.

 - By 30 days written notification by LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT to the U.S. Forest Service setting forth the reasons for termination, effective date, and in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated.

If, in the case of a partial termination, the U.S. Forest Service determines that the remaining portion of the award will not accomplish the purposes for which the award was made, the U.S. Forest Service may terminate the award in its entirety.

Upon termination of an award, LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of the award after the effective date, and shall cancel as many outstanding obligations as possible. - 3. In order to facilitate review on the record by the Director, AQM, LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT shall be given an opportunity to submit written evidence in support of its appeal. No hearing will be provided.
- 4. A decision under this provision by the Director, AQM is final
- 5. The final decision by the Director, AQM does not preclude LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT from pursuing remedies available under the law.
- Z. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the federal government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should LOUISVILLE/JEFFERSON COUNTY METRO GOVERNMENT or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay.
