04:05:50 Harrel Hurst presented a Power Point slide show detailing the advisory group objectives and perspectives regarding the South Floyd's Fork Plan (see recording for detailed presentation). Mr. Hurst described the SFF vision process, the Guiding Principles (CHASE), and various plan elements.

04:18:29 Mike Farmer, support, stated this has been an excellent important process, there was good feedback from the community, that the highest priority is Floyds Fork and the protection of the Tree Canopy. Mr. Farmer noted low impact development would benefit this area and decrease heat islands (see recording for detailed presentation).

04:22:07 Bert Stocker noted there is a greater risk to the conservation in this area if this plan is not implemented soon. Mr. Stocker stated he would like to see a general timeline for this project (see recording for detailed presentation).

04:24:27 Jeff Frank stated the document presented tonight is a guideline for the South Floyds Fork plan going forward. Mr. Frank noted the plan presented is community oriented. He would like to see that no more than 30% of impervious surfaces allowed would help save and maintain Floyds Fork (see recording for detailed presentation).

04:28:55 Steve Porter stated parklands are important and the water shed from Floyds Fork is important to preserve regardless of development (see recording for detailed presentation).

Ms. Armstrong noted the need for an appropriate boundary for the conservation form district. She presented documents to the Planning Commission of issues addressed by the BIA regarding the South Floyds Fork Plan (see recording for detailed presentation).

04:44:56 Commissioner Jarboe asked for clarification that Ms. Armstrong does not want the Planning Commission to take action for the South Floyds Fork Plan in today's hearing. Rachael Armstrong stated is opposed as written. Chuck Kavanaugh, advisor role to the BIA, stated the paper documents presented to Commissioners today were submitted previously for review and again today to ensure the documents are part of the record. They are not wanting to delay on taking action on the plan today (see recording for detailed presentation).

04:46:49 David Mindel stated there should be changes to the plan to the conservation areas with the Metropolitan Sewer District (see recording for detailed presentation). He noted every site is different for the preservation of the Tree Canopy in this area that should be considered.

Ms. Halbig noted the changes made to the Floyds Fork DRO (see recording for detailed presentation). Teena stated she would like to see more transparency regarding landownership and a 55% tree canopy preserved for the area.
