The following was discussed:

- There where 5 turf soccer fields put in 3 south Louisville parks
- There was a natural play area put in Russell Lee Park
- New play grounds were put in the California Park, Lannan Memorial Park, and Russell Lee Park
- There will be a 20-month study for the Parks for All that will cost approximately \$450,000
- The Parks Foundation is actively in conversation with potential donors for Parks for All
- The Parks Foundation will also contract with Center for Neighborhoods to help with the outreach and they anticipate that would cost around \$50,000
- The Parks Foundation is in the process of securing \$200,000 to get started and with more time will be able to raise the balance
- Question about whether the Parks Foundation will be focusing on acquiring new land in the suburban areas for parks
- The parks that Louisville currently has need alot of work and updating
- Question about getting federal money and making the parks system a priority
