Canada's Quebec Issue Inflamed

PARIS—Quebec's minister of education insisted yesterday that he had attended an international education conference here "on full equality with other countries."

The minister, Jean-Guy Cardinal, thus put the new Canadian government of Pierre Elliott Trudeau—a native of Quebec—in an awkward situation.

Trudeau's predecessor as prime minister, Lester B. Pearson, broke relations with the African republic of Gabon in January because Gabon had invited Car-

dinal as a full delegate to a conference of education ministers of French-speaking countries.

Last week's meeting in Paris, attended by 18 African countries and by Quebec, was a sequel to the Gabon session. And some Canadians had called for a diplo-

matic break with France if the same situation developed.

The fact that the Quebec flag, a white cross on a blue field with four fleurs de lys, was flown alongside others at a reception stirred Canadians further.

But Yvon Bourges, French secretary of state for international cooperation sought to ease the situation. At a closing news conference Friday night, he said the Quebec delegation had attended as "observers."

While this may have averted a crisis between Ottawa and Paris, Cardinal declined to take that way out for Quebec.

At a news conference a television reporter asked Cardinal to describe his status at the conference. "We participated fully—in my mind, in full equality with the other countries," Cardinal said. He said the federal government did not even have an education ministry, and education had always been an affair for the 10 members of the federation—he avoided the word "province."

Draft Board Won't See Things Student's Way

BOSTON (UPI)—Harold Krents, 23, a law student, has been reclassified I-A by his Mount Vernon, N.Y., draft board.

Krents has been blind all his life. The Harvard Law School student said yesterday his parents notified him that his 2-S student deferment has been canceled and that he has been given 30 days to appeal.

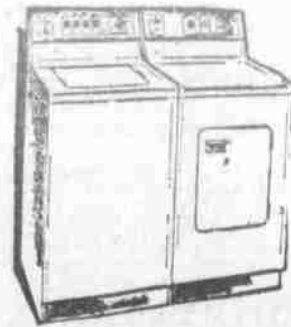
"I've written my draft board every year and told them I was blind, and therefore should be classified 4-F, but every year they notify me I'm classified 2-S," he said.

That is, until two days ago when his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Milton Krents of New York, were notified the student deferment was canceled.

Krents, who went through regular schools, including Harvard undergraduate school, said he is willing to go if the government really needs him.

"If I go my ambition is to be a bombardier," he said.
