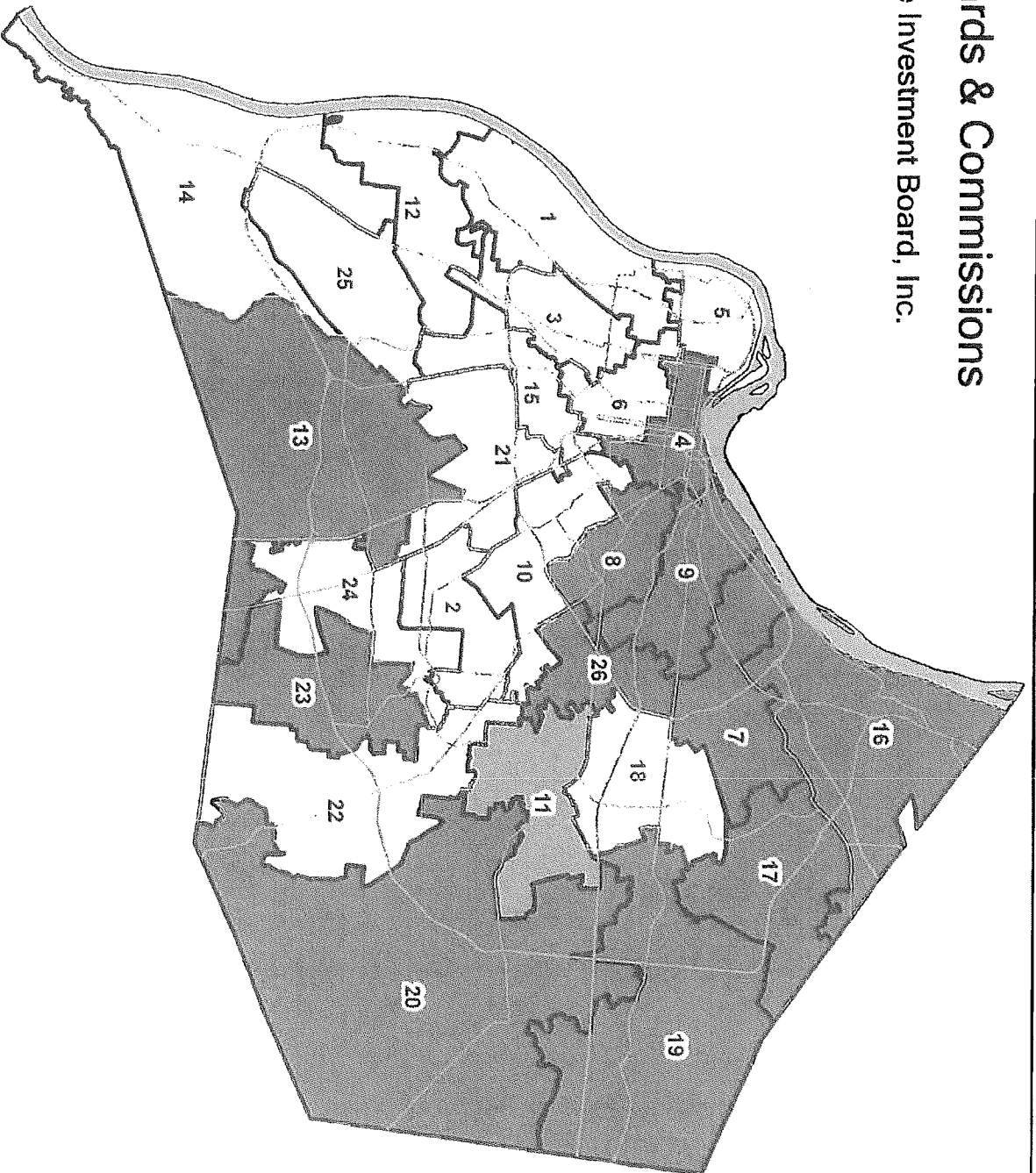

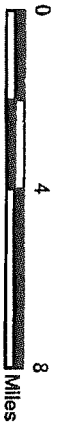

<p>PURPOSE</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Purposes</p> <p>(A) The Corporation is formed exclusively for charitable, educational and civic purposes, which include the following:</p> <p>(1) To conduct and carry on its work exclusively for charitable, educational and civic purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") (reference herein to sections or provisions of the Code shall be deemed to include and refer to, to the extent applicable, any similar sections or provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws); ~</p> <p>(2) To provide strategic leadership for workforce development efforts in Greater Louisville; and</p> <p>(3) To provide administrative support for private and public funding sources that can be used to carry out the workforce development efforts in Greater Louisville.</p> <p>(B) The Corporation is irrevocably dedicated to and is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). The Corporation shall receive contributions and fees, and shall distribute its funds for public, charitable, and/or educational purposes, as set forth in these Articles. In carrying out its corporate purposes, the Corporation shall have all the powers allowed corporations by the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Acts, KRS 273.161 <u>et seq.</u>; provided, however, that the Corporation shall not have or exercise any power inconsistent with or prohibited by the provisions of Paragraphs C, D, and, if applicable, E of this Article II.</p> <p>(C) As limited by Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, it is expressly not the purpose of the Corporation, and the Corporation is not empowered, to participate or intervene in (including the publication or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office, nor to devote more than an insubstantial part of its activities to carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.</p> <p>(D) Any other provision of these Articles to the contrary notwithstanding, the Corporation shall have no capital stock and no power to issue certificates of stock nor to declare dividends; no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual; and the Corporation shall not carry on any activities denied to a corporation described in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Code, including activities to the extent prohibited by Section 501(m) of the Code.</p> <p>(E) Any other provision of these Articles to the contrary notwithstanding, the Corporation shall, if the following provisions of law are applicable to it: [i] not engage in any act of self dealing as defined in Section 4941 of the Code; [ii] distribute its income for each fiscal year at such time and in such manner as not to be subject to the tax under Section 4942 of the Code; [iii] not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943 of the Code; [iv] not make any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code; and [v] not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945 of the Code.</p>
