

## Parks EQIP Funding

The Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP) through the USDA-NRCS has funded projects in Jefferson County for the past 7 years totaling \$395,119 in grants. Technical assistance included in the funding level raises the value to over a half-million dollars.

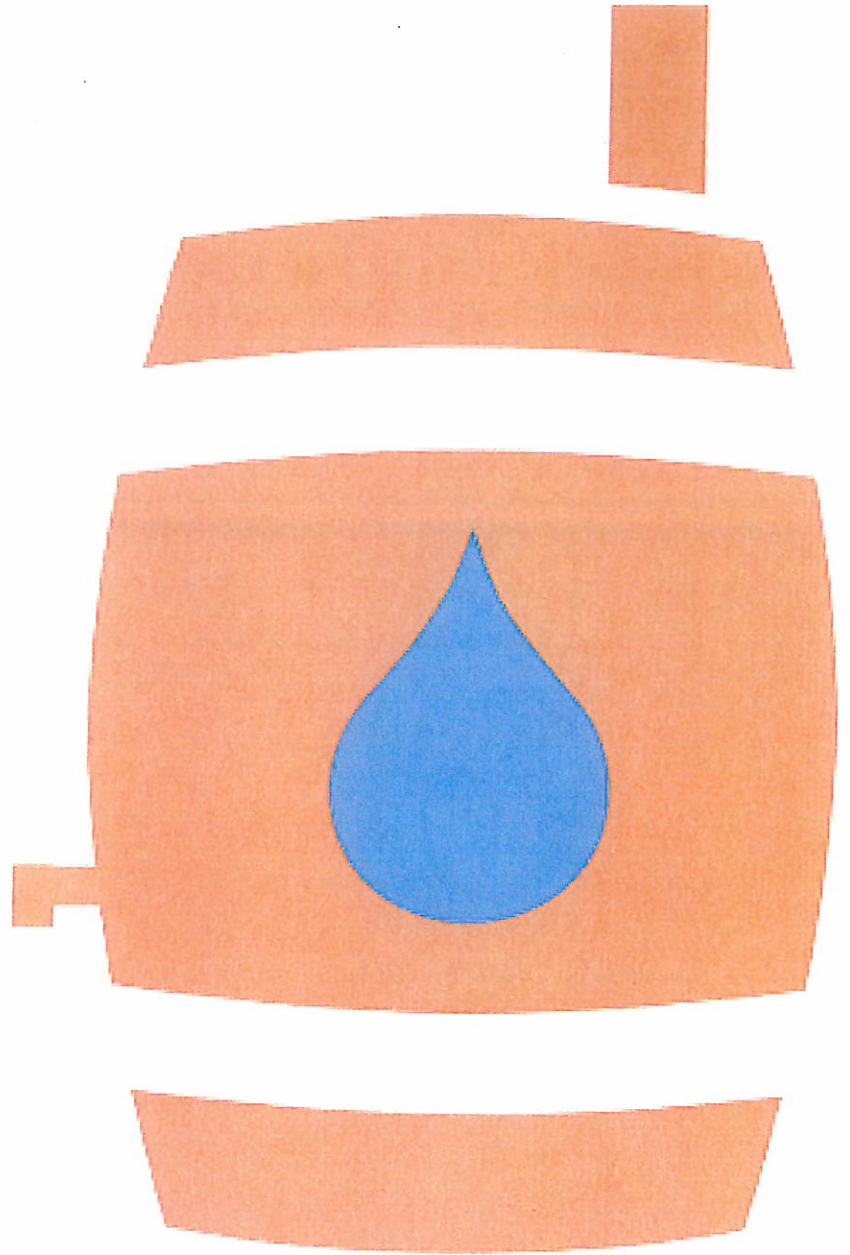
### Environmental Concerns addressed in our Parks
