As discussed yesterday, I don't think we are making an apples to apples comparison with QK4's survey fee since their proposal only includes a topo survey and does not include any of the associated boundary surveys and plat preparation needed to dedicate the roadway. After revisiting our scope and fee with our surveyor, we realized that we had allocated far too many hours for the boundary surveys along Damascus Court considering there are only three properties on this roadway. Based on these revisions, the total fee for the preliminary scope of services sent on 12/29/2020 can be updated to \$6,500. Please let me know if you need any further information.

Our preliminary fee to complete this survey and develop a plat is \$10,700. This fee includes preparing and delivering a plat of Damascus Court to Louisville Metro for the purpose of dedicating the road to public right of way, including all necessary deed research and field work to locate existing monumentation, resolve the boundaries adjoining Damascus Court, and set corner pins along the roadway to be dedicated. This fee also assumes that Metro will be responsible for obtaining any necessary signatures and approvals, undertaking the planning review process (along with any fees if they are not waived), and recording the plat. We can adjust our scope and fee accordingly if you would like Strand to take on any of these tasks.

A few notes/concerns from our surveyor after his initial review of this project:

CM Peden,

Attached are the results of the Damascus Ct analysis. We recommend removal of the existing concrete road and reconstruct as an asphalt road, comparable to the work that Public Works just completed on the public portion of Damascus Cir. The preliminary engineering cost estimate to reconstruct and meet Metro standards is \$59,815 but for budgeting purposes we recommend \$65,000.

There are two property owners on this section that would need to either dedicate the right-of-way or we would have to purchase. There will be an additional cost to prepare all of the legal documents when this one is ready to grant as a public right-of-way.
