All funds received and credited to Brightside programs for restricted purposes, if unexpended as of June 30, 2018, shall be Designated From Fund Balance for expenditure in Fiscal Year 2018-2019 and restricted for purposes for which the funds were received. Any unexpended funds as of June 30, 2018, related to the market rate housing initiative, vacant and abandoned properties initiative, the green roof incentive initiative, Louisville CARES initiative, vacant and abandoned properties acquisitions initiative, NOW (redevelopment strategies), heat island incentives, the sustainability study, <u>California Neischborhood Plan</u>. D5 may appropriate additional NDF funds to Develop Louisville through a NDF Agency Request Form in order to increase D5's portion of the FY 2019 Metro Housing Resource Center Contract operating budget. If D5 plans to appropriate an amount greater than \$5,000, then an ordinance will be required as well. The Metro Housing Resource Center contract provides emergency home repair programs, exterior paint and dusk to dawn lights in districts 1, 3 and 5.
