Message: I was deeply disappointed to read Mayor Greenberg's proposed data center regulations. They do nothing to protect Louisvillians from rate hikes and/or poorer services. The short-sitedness behind the proposal is staggering. All signs point to strained finances in AI companies right now. Louisvillians will be left holding the bill for these disastrous data centers.

Louisville should put a temporary moratorium on all data centers, including the Camp Ground Road data center. During this pause new regulations should be thoughtfully created with a minimum of:

1. Protection of Louisvillians from rate hikes and/or poorer services as have

happened in many other communities with data centers.

2. Environmental protections that ensure waste water from cooling the center is clean and free of industrial bacteria (release of industrial bacteria happened recently at a Meta owned data center interrupting water services for the city).

3. Emissions and energy use must fall in line with Louisville's 100% renewables goal.

4. Noise pollution and heat island effects should not negatively impact Louisvillians or local wildlife.

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
