AS OF THIS MORNING,
1,790 LITTLE VILLIANS HAVE DIED AND 129,901 LOUISVILLIANS
HAVE BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH COVID-19.
WE MOVED BACK INTO THE RED ZONE SINCE OUR LAST MEETING.
OUR NUMBERS ARE INCREASING AGAIN IN JEFFERSON COUNTY,
1,585,980 COVID VACCINE DOSES HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.
WE NEED TO CONTINUE ENCOURAGING OUR FAMILIES
AND OUR FRIENDS TO BE VACCINATED,
ESPECIALLY AS WE ARE ENTERING THE HOLIDAY SEASON
AND A NEW VARIANT HAS EMERGED.
WE ALSO WANT TO KEEP OUR FELLOW KENTUCKY INS
WHO ARE AFFECTED BY THE UNPRECEDENTED TORNADO

THIS PAST WEEKEND IN OUR HEARTS AND MINDS,
WE LOST 74 LIVES, INCLUDING 12 CHILDREN.
THE PROPERTY DAMAGE IS UNIMAGINABLE,
AND WE WANT TO KEEP THEM IN OUR THOUGHTS AND OUR PRAYERS.
THERE ARE SEVERAL DONATION DRIVES THAT ARE GOING ON
AS WELL AS DESPERATELY
'CAUSE THEY'RE DESPERATELY NEED FOOD AND BLOOD
AND THOSE VITAL THINGS.
AND I ENCOURAGE US ALL TO TRY TO PARTICIPATE,
TO HELP OUR FELLOW KENTUCKIANS.
AND WITH THAT BEING SAID,
I WOULD LIKE US TO TAKE A MOMENT OF SILENCE.
THANK YOU, COUNCILMAN GREEN.
I BELIEVE YOU HAVE A SPECIAL RECOGNITION THIS EVENING.
>>THANK YOU MR. PRESIDENT,
AND THANK YOU COLLEAGUES FOR INDULGING ME ON THIS.
AS MANY OF YOU ALL ARE AWARE,
ONE OF MOST CHERISH NATIVE SONS,
IS THERE A GRIP OF DR. DUNKIN SIGN?
AND WE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO CELEBRATE
DR. DUNKIN'S TIME A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO.
HOWEVER, I WOULD BE REMISSIVE.
I DID NOT TAKE THE TIME TO RECOGNIZE THE PRIVATE CITIZENS
WHO MADE THIS HAPPEN.
AND SO I AM SO PLEASED TO RECOGNIZE AND TO HONOR,
AND TO PUBLICLY THANK MIGUEL AND DOROTHY HUTTON,
WHO PREVIOUSLY PURCHASED GRIFF'S FAMILY HOME
THAT HE GREW UP IN AND THEY WERE SO KIND OF ENOUGH
TO ALLOW US TO PERMANENTLY ERECT A PLACARD
IN THEIR FRONT YARD.
THEY DID NOT HAVE TO DO THAT.
AND I WAS JUST RAISED WHEN PEOPLE ARE NICE TO YOU.
YOU SAY, THANK YOU.
AND SO TO THE HUTCHINS,
WE ARE SO, SO GRATEFUL THE ENTIRE CITY OF WOODVILLE.
THANKS YOU FOR ALLOWING US TO HONOR OUR HOMETOWN HERO.
AND SO I DO HAVE A PROCLAMATION
THAT I WILL BE READING TO HIM.
MS. BENTLEY IS THERE TO BE ABLE TO PRESENT IT TO HIM.
AND LET ME READ THIS TO ALL
WHOM THESE LETTERS SHALL COME GREETINGS,
KNOW YE THAT THE LOUISVILLE METRO COUNCIL HEREBY RECOGNIZES
AND HONORS MIGUEL AND DOROTHY HUTTON.
WHEREAS MIGUEL AND DOROTHY HUTTON HAVE SHOWN
THEIR COMMITMENT TO THE CITIZENS OF METRO LOUISVILLE
AND DISTRICT ONE WITH THEIR WILLINGNESS

TO SHARE THEIR PROPERTY WITH THE METRO GOVERNMENT AND WORLD.
AS WE HONORED OUR VERY OWN DARRELL GRIFFITH,
AKA DR. DUNKIN STEIN,
WHEREAS MIGUEL AND DOROTHY ALLOWED HISTORICAL PLAQUE

THE FAMILY HEALTH CENTERS HAVE GROWN TO NETWORK OF EIGHT
COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS THAT SERVE MORE THAN 45,000 PEOPLE
A YEAR INTEGRATING MEDICAL, DENTAL, BEHAVIORAL HEALTH,
SUBSTANCE ABUSE, AND MANY OTHER SERVICES.
AND WHERE IS BILL HAS SERVED ON NUMEROUS BOARDS
THROUGHOUT THE YEARS,
INCLUDING LOCAL METRO HEALTH BOARD PASSPORT HEALTH PLAN
AND U OF L HEALTH
BILL MOST RECENTLY SERVED ON THE MOBILE COVID
VACCINATION DISTRIBUTION TASK FORCE.
AND WHEREAS DURING BILL'S TENURE FAMILY HEALTH CENTERS
LAUNCHED THE LARGEST HEALTHCARE FOR HOMELESS
AND THE REFUGEE HEALTH SCREENING PROGRAMS IN KENTUCKY
AND PARTICIPATED IN THE FOUNDING
OF THE PASSPORT HEALTH PLAN.

AND WHEREAS BILL'S GUIDING PRINCIPLE WAS,
HAS ALWAYS BEEN THAT HELP IS RIGHT AND NOT A PRIVILEGE.
HEALTH IS A RIGHT AND NOT A PRIVILEGED.

AND WHEREAS BILL,
WHILE WE ARE SADDENED TO LOSE BILL LEADERSHIP
AT FAMILY HEALTH CENTERS,
WE KNOW THAT HE WILL CONTINUE
TO SEE HIS COMMITMENT TO THE PURSUIT OF HEALTH, EQUITY,
AND CARE AND ACCESS FOR ALL IN THE COMMUNITY.
WE HEAR BY CONFER THIS HONOR
WITH ALL THE RIGHTS, PRIVILEGES,
AND RESPONSIBILITIES THERE IN TO PERTAINING AND TESTIMONY,
WE HAVE CAUSED THESE LETTERS TO BE MADE
AND THE SEAL OF LOUISVILLE METRO GOVERNMENT
TO BE HERE ON TWO EFFECTS DONE
IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY,
THE 16TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 2021.

HANGING FROM A LIGHT FIXTURE AND A CELL OFFICER MIRANDA

GRAYSON IMMEDIATELY CALLED FOR ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE

AND WAS OFFICER IVAN SAMPLE HELD THE PERSON

OUT IN AN ATTEMPT TO RELIEVE PRESSURE FROM THE NEWS

AND GET THE PERSON UNTIED

FROM THE LIGHT FIXTURE.

AND WHEREAS AFTER THAT,

THE PERSON WAS UNTIED.

OFFICER SAMPLE CARRIED THE PERSON OUT OF THE CELL.

THE MOOSE WAS CUT AWAY FROM THE PERSON'S NECK

AND LIFE-SAVING MEDICAL CARE WAS ADMINISTERED.

AND WHEREAS ON THE SAME EVENING AT APPROXIMATELY 8:00 PM,

OFFICER ERIC DELGADO RODRIGUEZ DESERVED SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR

IN A DORM ON THE THIRD FLOOR AND NOTIFIED SERGEANT JONES

AND WHERE'S OFFICER DELGADO,
THE TRIGGERS ENTERED THE LIVING AREA TO INVESTIGATE
AND FOUND A PERSON NOT BREATHING
AND ABSENT OF A PULSE AND WHERE SERGEANT JONES
IMMEDIATELY REQUESTED ADDITIONAL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.
AS CPR IN NARCAN WERE ADMINISTERED BY OFFICER SAMPLE,
A AED WAS UTILIZED AND EMS WAS NOTIFIED
AND WHERE AS NURSE BRAND
FREMONT RESPONDED TO THE CRITICAL INCIDENT
AND ROTATE IT CYCLE ON AND OFF WITH CPR
FOR 10 MINUTES WITH OFFICERS SAMPLE
AND GRAYSON UNTIL EMS ARRIVED.
AND WHEREAS AFTER 10 MINUTES OF CPR
AND THREE ROUNDS OF NARCAN,
A PULSE WAS FOUND AND THE PERSON BEGAN BREATHING ON HIS OWN,
EMS ARRIVED APPROXIMATELY TWO MINUTES LATER
AND TRANSPORTED THE PERSON TO THE HOSPITAL.
AND WHEREAS WITHOUT A DOUBT,
IT IS DUE TO THE QUICK ACTION AND DILIGENT EFFORTS
OF THESE OFFICERS THAT THESE PERSONS ARE ALIVE TODAY.
AND WHEREAS WE ARE GRATEFUL
FOR THE OUTSTANDING SERVICES OF THESE OFFICERS
AND ESPECIALLY DURING THIS UNPRECEDENTED TIME
OF A DEMAND OF A PANDEMIC.
AND WHEREAS OFFICER SKAGGS BEGAN HIS CAREER
WITH THE LITTLE METRO CORRECTIONS ON FEBRUARY 1ST,
2013 AND HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN THESE LIFESAVING INMATES
AND OVERDOSES FOR A PERIOD OF TIME,
WE HEAR BY CONFERRING HONOR,
ALL THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES AND RESPONSIBILITIES
THEY'RE IN TO PERTAINING IN TESTIMONY THEREOF.
WE HAVE CAUSED THESE LETTERS TO BE MADE
IN THE SEAL OF LOUISVILLE,
METRO COUNCIL AND METRO GOVERNMENT TO BE HERE ON TWO EFFECTS
AND DONE IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY,
THE 16TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 2021.
I WANT TO THANK YOU FOR EVERYTHING
THAT YOU ALL DO EACH AND EVERY DAY.
(AUDIENCE CLAPPING)

OFFICERS LIKE OFFICER GRAYSON,
SHE FOUND THE ONE INMATE HANGING DID NOT SAY ANY JOB,

IS TIED TO THE STATE RECORDS RETENTION SCHEDULE,
WHICH ALLOWS DESTRUCTION AFTER THAT PERIOD OF TIME,
BY TYING DESTRUCTION
TO THE RECORD RETENTION POLICY AT THE STATE,
WE'RE GIVING AWAY OUR LOCAL ABILITY TO CONTROL THE PROCESS.
AND INSTEAD WE'RE LETTING
A STATE ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION DETERMINE
HOW LONG WE KEEP THESE TYPES OF COMPLAINTS
AND IMPORTANT PUBLIC RECORDS.
SOME MIGHT SAY THAT THAT'S OKAY,
THAT INFORMAL COMPLAINTS ARE LESS IMPORTANT.
THAT'S NOT TRUE.
THE SUPREME COURT WAS VERY CLEAR IN 1983
THAT A CON ANY COMPLAINT
THAT SPAWNS AN INVESTIGATION
SHOULD BE TREATED THE SAME WAY UNDER OPEN RECORDS LAW.
ALTHOUGH THIS CONTRACT USES WORDS LIKE FORMAL
AND INFORMAL A COMPLAINT IS A COMPLAINT.
AS FAR AS THE LAW IS CONCERNED,
WHATEVER PROCESS SOMEONE GOES THROUGH TO FILE,
IT SHOULD NOT MATTER.
THE PUBLIC.
THE LAW IS CLEAR.
THE PUBLIC HAS A RIGHT TO SEE THESE COMPLAINTS
AND THE INVESTIGATIONS THEY TO A LITTLE OVER SIX MONTHS AGO,
THE SUPREME COURT REITERATED
THAT POLICE INVESTIGATION FILES ARE PUBLIC RECORDS,

SUBJECT TO THE OPEN OPEN RECORDS ACT,
AND THAT THE PUBLIC HAS A RIGHT TO SEE THEM.
AND THIS ISN'T ABOUT JUDGING
THE CONDUCT OF ANY PARTICULAR POLICE OFFICERS.
IT'S ABOUT ENSURING THAT THE PUBLIC
HAS THE ABILITY TO UNDERSTAND HOW DECISIONS ARE MADE.
INVESTIGATIONS ARE CARRIED OUT
AND CONCLUSIONS ARE REACHED.
IT'S ABOUT LETTING THE PUBLIC,

I THINK THAT'S PART OF THE LEGAL REVIEW.
I DON'T KNOW THAT THIS IS WRITTEN IN A WAY THAT THAT WOULD

A NEW BODY SCANNER.

I'M NOT SURE WHAT THE STATUS OF THAT IS.

AND COUNCILMAN HOLLANDER,

YOU MAY OR MAY NOT KNOW,

BUT THEY HAVE ASKED FOR THAT,

BUT I FEEL CERTAIN COUNCILWOMAN MCCRANEY THAT,

ONCE THESE DOGS ARE BROUGHT TO OUR JAIL SYSTEM,

THAT THEY WILL HAVE THE ABILITY TO NOT ONLY SNIFF THE DRUGS
THAT ARE ON THE INMATES,
BUT FOR HEAVEN SAKE,
IF SOMETHING'S FOUND ON SOME VENDOR,
SOMEONE THAT BRINGS SUPPLIES OR FOOD
INTO THE JAIL OR WORST CASE SCENARIO
AND AN EMPLOYEE THAT THOSE DRUGS WOULD BE FOUND
AS WELL NOW TO KEEP THE DRUGS
FROM ENTERING THE JAIL.
AGAIN, I HAVE HAD CONVERSATION
WITH DIRECTOR CLARK WHO SAYS HE'S HOPEFUL

ON VENDORS AND EMPLOYEES AS WELL.
AND HE SAID,
IT'S FOR THE JAIL SIDE ONLY.
SO I BELIEVE THAT THE ADDITION OF THIS CANINE UNIT
BY ADDING THEM TO, DIRECTLY IN THE CELLS
AND ON THE FLOORS WITH THE INMATES
WHERE ALL THE ACTIVITY TAKES PLACE,
THAT WE WILL BE VERY SUCCESSFUL
IN REMOVING MOST OF THE DRUG PROBLEM THAT EXIST.
AND, JUST THEIR MERE PRESENCE
IN THE JAIL IS A DETERRENT.
AS WE KNOW IT,
I'VE DONE QUITE A BIT OF RESEARCH
ON HAVING DRUG DOGS IN THE JAIL.
IN FACT, MOST OF OUR JAILS DO HAVE CANINE UNITS.
SO THESE ARE AGAIN NON-AGGRESSIVE DOGS,
BUT THEY HAVE,
THEIR SENSE OF SMELL IS 10,000 TO 100 TIMES,
100,000 TIMES GREATER THAN A HUMAN.
AND, WHEN THEY SMELL THESE DRUGS, THEY SIT ONCE,
ONCE THEY'RE DETECTED.
SO WE HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT
WITH A TRAINING UNIT IN GEORGIA WHO,
ASSURES US THAT THIS IS ONE GOOD WAY
TO TACKLE AN ISSUE ON TOP OF THAT.
IT'S VERY COST-EFFECTIVE.
AND THIS HAS PENNIES IN THE BUCKET COMPARED
TO THE COST OF A BODY SCANNER.
IT'S ALSO PENNIES IN A BUCKET.
WHEN WE TALK ABOUT THE, THE NATURE OF THE BEAST,
WHEN WE HAVE TO ASK OUR OFFICERS TO GET DOWN
ON THEIR HANDS AND KNEES AND, AND GIVE CPR,
AND FIRST AID TO SOMEONE TO TRY TO BRING THEM BACK

TO LIFE FOR NARCAN AND THE TRAUMA
THAT THEY EXPERIENCED AS AN OFFICER.
SO IF WE CAN PREVENT ANY OVERDOSED
AND I EXPECT THAT WE WILL PREVENT, SEVERAL MANY,
THEN I THINK IT'S WORTH IT.

SO THANK YOU.

AND I HOPE YOU, WE'LL SUPPORT THIS.

>>THANK YOU, COUNCIWOLMAN.

COUNCILOR, MCCRANEY THAT,
ANSWER YOUR QUESTION.

>>WELL, IN A ROUND ABOUT WAY,
CERTAINLY I WOULD SUPPORT THIS INITIATIVE,
BUT I WANT TO MAKE CERTAIN THAT WE ARE CROSSING THE T'S
AND DOTTING THE I'S JEW.

ABANDONED VEHICLES CERTAINLY
COME AT A COST IN OUR COMMUNITY.

THEY CREATE SAFETY ISSUES.

THEY LIMIT ACCESSIBILITY TO PUBLIC SPACE
AND CONTRIBUTE TO BLIGHT.

THE TOW LOT HAS BEEN SEVERELY OVER CAPACITY.

I THINK AT THE TIME OF THE FILING FILING OF THIS,

WE WERE OVER 1000 VEHICLES

AND WE HAD A LIST OF KNOWN VEHICLES

THAT WERE WAITING TO BE PICKED UP OF ABOUT 140

AS PRESIDENT JAMES WILL REMIND US THAT NUMBER IS FLUID,

BUT I THINK IT'S CERTAINLY WELL FELT IN THE COMMUNITY

AS THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE TOW LOT LMPD HAS BEEN WORKING ON AN ARRAY OF SOLUTIONS. AND ONE OF THE MANY THAT HAS BEEN PROPOSED IS AN AMNESTY PERIOD THAT WOULD ALLOW PEOPLE TO COME GET THEIR VEHICLES DURING A SET PERIOD OF TIME WHERE THE TOWING AND STORAGE FEES ARE WAIVED, THE ORDINANCE WOULD GIVE LMPD UP TO 30 DAYS WITHIN A YEAR TO IMPLEMENT THE AMNESTY PERIOD. THERE ARE EXCEPTIONS TO THE AMNESTY PERIOD THAT WOULD INCLUDE VEHICLES THAT ARE TOWED FOR GRAFFITI, ILLEGAL DUMPING, STOLEN VEHICLES, VEHICLES THAT ARE IMMOBILIZED BECAUSE OF A BOOT AND THOSE WITH PARK FEES. LET ME JUST GO BACK TO SAY THE VEHICLES THAT ARE EXCLUDED ARE VEHICLES THAT HAVE A HISTORY OF BEING STOLEN INVOLVED IN THEFT, COUNCILWOMAN PARKER ADDED AN AMENDMENT CODIFIED THAT LMPD WHAT ALREADY EXISTS WITH AN LMPD POLICY. AND THAT SAYS THAT VEHICLES THAT HAVE BEEN STOLEN AND IMPOUNDED WON'T BE REQUIRED TO PAY A TOWING FEE. SHE MIGHT WANT TO SPEAK ABOUT THAT WITH THAT BEING SAID, I'LL TURN IT OVER TO CO-SPONSORS HOLLANDER AND ARTHUR. AND I KNOW BEFORE WE VOTE, PRESIDENT JEFFERSON COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE HAS A TECHNICAL AMENDMENT FOR US TO CONSIDER THAT WOULD JUST BASICALLY SPECIFY WHO CAN REQUEST THE AMNESTY PERIOD AS IT RELATES TO THE OPERATOR OF THE TOA. I JUST WANT TO THANK COUNSELOR MAJORIS FOR DOING, HAVING THE LABORING OR ON THIS.

I THINK PEOPLE SHOULD UNDERSTAND

THIS IS NOT GOING TO SOLVE

ALL OF OUR PROBLEMS AT THE TOW LOT,

BUT IF IT GETS ONE CAR OFF THE STREET

I HATE TO ASK YOU TO DO THIS.

COULD YOU PLEASE REPEAT THE EXCLUSIONS FOR ME PLEASE?

>>CERTAINLY.

AND I WOULD ASK THE COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TO ASSIST IF I'M MISSING ANYTHING.

I BELIEVE IT IS FOR THINGS LIKE VEHICLES INVOLVED WITH GRAFFITI VEHICLES INVOLVED WITH STOLE LIKE A THEFT OR PARTICIPATION IN THE THEFT.

IT DOES NOT INCLUDE PARK FEES.

SO IF A VEHICLE HAS A LOT OF PARKING CITATIONS, IT DOESN'T INCLUDE LIKE IF A VEHICLE HAS BEEN BOOTED, AM I MISSING SOMETHING ILLEGAL DUMPING?

DID I SAY THAT?

AND UNDER THE ORDINANCE CURRENTLY
YOU HAVE TO SHOW PROOF OF OWNERSHIP
AND PROPER IDENTIFICATION.
SO THOSE WOULD BE THE ONLY PREREQUISITES
TO PICK UP YOUR CAR UNLESS IT WAS,
UNLESS THE CAR WAS TOWED UNDER THE EXCEPTIONS
