- Questions about whether Cherokee Park is in process of being opened
- Questions about whether Metro Council would vote to make the temporary plan of reopening September 1, 2021 permanent
- Questions about whether 60 days closure of roads would be enough time to repair roads

- Metro Parks would have to get Metro Council's approval to extend closure more than 60 days
- Questions about whether the roads were still close without anything to do with the COVID-19 pandemic
- Questions and concerns about whether to table this item since all the sponsors are not present
- Questions and concerns about the public's input about the plan of which roads are to be open and which roads are to be closed around Cherokee Park
- Question about the time that the gates would be open for Cherokee and Iroquois Parks
- Questions about whether a permit was required when Cherokee Park did car free days
