Jeff,

Does the below email still stand? During our conversation about paving this year I discussed David's desire to repave Hardwood Forest Drive, between Princess Wood Court to Dead End and then possibly assist in installing speed humps. I see below that from 3419 Hardwood Forest to Dead End is Bonded in Section 2.

As is expressed in the attached email Hardwood Forest's bonds have been forfeited but the funds are still waiting to be sent. Is it possible to time the use of these funds for the paving of Section 2 (3419 Hardwood Forest Drive to Dead End) with the paving of Section 1 (Princess Wood Court to 3419 Hardwood Forest Drive) by including these funds in the budget or as a CIF if necessary?

If so, I wish to request a quote for the cost of the paving between Princess Wood Court to 3419 Hardwood Forest Drive.

Brian,

Most of Hardwood Forest Dr is still within a bonded subdivision that is under construction. What that means, the developer is still responsible for the public roads in the subdivision. Final surface of asphalt hasn't been installed either because of the ongoing construction of single family homes. Final asphalt isn't typically installed until the subdivision is 80% to 95% complete. I recommend removing your request for paving of Hardwood Forest Dr between Princess Wood Ct and dead end because this will be the responsibility of the developer and it is an active construction site which could result in substantial damage to a freshly paved road.
