Marilyn W. Lewis, PE retired in May 2015 after a 32-year career with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Her last assignment was Chief, Engineering Division for the Louisville District, one of the largest districts in the Corps. The District oversees both civil works and military construction in a five-state area and services span a broad spectrum of activities, from environmental, regulatory and flood control work to planning, design, and construction.

Ms. Lewis currently works with American Engineers, Inc. as the Director of Government Markets helping to develop strategies and focus on federal, state and local government work.

Ms. Lewis is a graduate of Tennessee Technological University with a BS degree in Civil Engineering. She received a MS in Engineering Administration from the University of Tennessee.

She began her professional career as an engineering consultant with a Nashville, Tennessee environmental firm. She later served as City Engineer for the City of Gallatin, Tennessee where she had responsibility for infrastructure design and construction as well as enforcement of zoning and signage regulations.

In her career with the Louisville District she worked mainly with the Military Program in both a technical and project management capacity and spent six years as Chief of Environmental. She had responsibility for the selection and management of Architect-Engineer contracts as well as the planning, design and construction of military, civil works and environmental projects. She served as a senior instructor for the Corps of Engineers on A/E Contracting for over 20 years.

Ms. Lewis is a registered professional engineer in Tennessee and a member of the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME) and the Kentucky Society of Professional Engineers (KSPE). She is a past president of the Kentuckiana Post, SAME and was inducted in the SAME Academy of Fellows with the class of 2011. She was elected to serve on the SAME National Board of Directors for 2012-2015.

Ms. Lewis was appointed to the Louisville Metro Planning Commission in July 2015 and currently serves as Vice-Chair of the ten member commission as well as the Chair of the Land Development and Transportation Committee.

Ms. Lewis is married to Rick Lewis, a retired civil engineer, and has a son and a daughter, as well as a daughter-in-law, all of whom are engineers.
