- Reference to an outline (see attachment) for the Council to use as it considers its social media options
- Focus on consistency and branding
- Considering each Council Members social media usage and how it may become comparative
- Consequences of content
- Decisions on whether to allow live questions, feedback/comments, Inbox messages, etc. and being consistent
- All District offices using the same banner for branding purposes
- Having a social media manager or consultant that assists each District office with developing their social media/communications plan
- Which social media platforms to use and understanding how they each work
- Considering the cost of not only a staff person, but also for additional services provided, such as the option to boost posts on Facebook, and considering if it would be a cost to each District office or the Council as a whole
- Working through the challenge of the digital divide
