### Describe Agency's Vision, Mission and Services:

The George Rogers Clark Park Neighborhood Association, Inc. also known as GRCPNA was formed exclusively for charitable and educational purposes as stated in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. GRCPNA is a non-profit organization of resident volunteers formed specifically to enhance the health, safety and welfare of the members of the community by providing a forum to discuss and resolve neighborhood issues, build a sense of community by encouraging volunteer involvement in various programs and events, educate the residents and general public about issues such as: airport noise, sewage and drainage issues, crime prevention, gardening and beautification projects. And to preserve, protect and improve the 40+ acre Metro Public George Rogers Clark Park that lays within our neighborhood boundaries. In cooperation with Metro Parks, we participate in the "Adopt the Park" program for GRCP which is supported by volunteers. George Rogers Clark Park is the site of the Clark family's original homestead "Mulberry Hill Estate" where George Rogers Clark's parents, brother and sisters settled when they moved form Virginia. (Pamphlet attached). In addition, part of Camp Taylor was located in our neighborhood. Some of the original Camp Taylor buildings still stand. We have a rich history which we are very proud of and GRCPNA is committed to preserve and foster the significant history of our neighborhood.

We encourage a spirit of friendliness and cooperation with other groups in the neighborhood and throughout Louisville/Jefferson County Metro. We invite other non-profit organizations such as the Nature Center, Bluegrass Alliance, Center for Neighborhoods, etc. to participate in our events and meetings. With support and help from LMPD, we have a very successful email block watch and have a close working relationship with our 6th Division Police Department.

We have approximately 1200 households within our neighborhood boundaries and membership is offered as a means to defray some of our expenses. Membership is open to all businesses and residents within the neighborhood boundaries An associate membership is offered to businesses and individuals who live outside our neighborhood and subscribe to the purposes of GRCPNA as defined in Article II - Purposes in our Bylaws. We also raise funds by holding a neighborhood yard sale, flower and baker sale each year.

This is our 5th year as an Metro Louisville neighborhood association. Our very first event as an association and our main event each year is our Fall Festival the "Mulberry Hill Fall Festival" at George Rogers Clark Park. Held the 3rd Saturday of October, we bring neighbors and others in our community together for a day of fun, food and games. We also use the festival as an opportunity to share the rich history of the Clark Family homestead "Mulberry Hill Estate".

Last year was our first year for concerts in George Rogers Clark Park. The concerts are growing in popularity. Weather permitting we have scheduled two concerts this fiscal year, one in August, 2015 and another in June, 2016.

Spring, 2016 will be our 3rd Easter Egg Hunt at George Rogers Clark Park. The Easter Egg Hunt has been a big success. The children are so much fun to watch and it's a wonderful venue to bring families together for a fun event. Hopefully the Easter Bunny will be at our Spring 2016 Easter Egg Hunt if our funding goes through. We plan on buying an Easter Bunny Costume.

Our Quarterly Neighborhood Meetings use a basic format that includes a short business meeting directed by the President, followed by a keynote speaker on a subject of interest with time for Q and A. When possible we invite 6th District LMPD to attend and report on crime in our neighborhood and answers citizens concerns. Guest Speakers in the past have included our Councilman, Steve Magree, and of course our deeply missed, Jim King, representatives from MSD, Airport Authority on Airport Noise, Parks Department. beautification, etc.

Our annual meeting in May of each year is our time to party and celebrate our pride in our neighborhood and vote new board of directors and officers as their terms expire.

This is the first year that we are offering a 24 week Yoga Class with an experienced instructor. We're hoping that this class will be well attended. It's popularity will determine if this becomes and annual event.

Lastly I wish to express how fortunate we are to have George Rogers Clark Park as an integral part of our neighborhood and to be able to use the park to reach out to the whole community of Metro Louisville. The Park defines us and we are very proud and protective of the park. Volunteers from the neighborhood walk through the park daily picking up trash and keeping our neighborhood and park a great place to live.

Easter Egg Hunt at the Park Spring 2016 funding will be spent on Easter Eggs, candy, and a one time cost of a Easter Bunny Costume.

Annual Yard Sale, Flower and Bakery Sale. This is a fund raiser and all items are donated but funding will be spent on promotion newspaper ad, posters, etc.

5th Annual GRCPNA "Mulberry Hill" Fall Festival - This is our annual fall festival for the neighborhood and the community. Funding will be spent on a Disc Jockey, refreshments,, food, blowup slide for the children, treats for the children. Decorations, face painting supplies, pumpkins for decorating. Historicial display. Chili cook-off supplies.

GRCPNA YOGA Classes - funding will be spent to pay instructor Rebecca Dyer Burnett for 1 class a week for 24 weeks at \$40/class.



### GEORGE ROGERS CLARK PARK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION, INC,

 The following provisions of the Articles of Incorporation of the George Rogers Clark Park Neighborhood Association, Inc., a Kentucky non-profit corporation, non-stock corporation, filed in the Commonwealth of Kentucky on May 25, 2010, be and are amended in the following particulars:

Article IV - Name be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

### Articles of Incorporation of George Rogers Clark Park Neighborhood Association, Inc.

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, having associated for the purposes of forming a non-profit, non-stock corporation, under and pursuant to the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and more particularly Chapter 273, Kentucky Revised Statutes (KRS), hereby certify as follows:
