

2014 – Louisville Water's Value





- On-Site chlorine generation at B.E. Payne Treatment Facility
- Successfully managed through two winter emergencies with over 380 water main breaks in 60 days
- Managed the West Virginia chemical spill with no impact
- National focus on urgent need for infrastructure investment
- Maintain nearly 24,000 public fire hydrants
- Maintain 4,200 miles of main

- Opened Louisville Water Tower Park, a community asset for the public with the WaterWorks Museum
- Louisville gets "back to the tap"




2014 Review and Highlights





Stockholder Benefit

Louisville Water Company creates value for Louisville Metro by:

- Investing 50% of adjusted net income into the infrastructure of the Water Works
- Distributing the balance of adjusted net income as a dividend to Louisville Metro
- Providing free water to all Metro buildings, parks, the Zoo and Waterfront Park, a value of \$3.8 million in 2014
- Free fire protection with nearly 24,000 public fire hydrants



2015 Operating Budget


- Budgeted consumption, 34.8 billion gallons, in line with 2014
- Total operating revenue of \$175.0 million
- Operating and maintenance expenses of \$71.2 million, an increase of 2.8% over 2014 budget
- Depreciation expense of \$33.2 million, an increase of 6.7% over 2014 budget
- Savings achieved with MSD partnerships projected total of \$1 million
- Dividend budgeted at \$20.5 million



Capital Budget Highlights

 The Proposed 2015 Capital Budget includes \$89.6 million (before cash reimbursement):

2015 Capital Projects

Infrastructure Renewal

- Design and begin to rehabilitate the critical 48-inch transmission main along Eastern Parkway
- New technology to inspect 7 miles of larger transmission mains while they remain filled with water and in service
- Repair/replace up to 10 miles of smaller distribution water mains
- Continue Lead Service Renewal Program
- Aqueous Ammonia Plant

New Customer Care & Billing System


- Replacing 15-year-old billing system in spring 2015

- Mobile workforce management for crews








Consumption and Customers 2003-2015






Consumption and Miles of Main 2003-2014






2014 Water Rate Comparison






WATER RATE COMPARISON 2014
