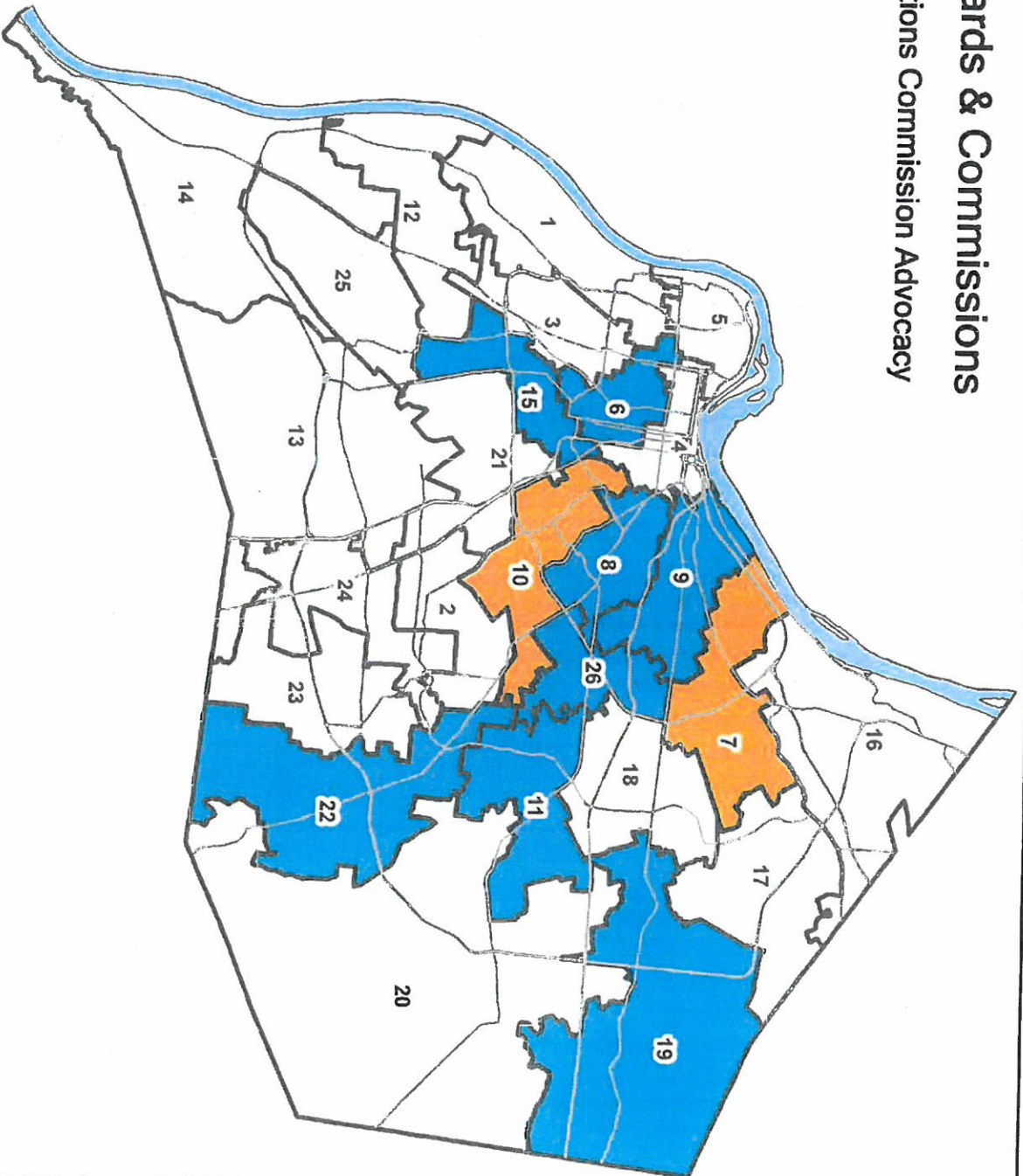

NUMBER OF MEMBERS	10
HOW APPOINTED	Mayor with approval of Council
EX OFFICIO MEMBERS	None
QUALIFICATION OF MEMBERS	Members shall reside in Jefferson County and no more than one member shall reside within any council district. The members so appointed shall include persons who are representative of the several social, economic, cultural, ethnic, and racial groups that comprise the population of Metro Louisville.
COUNCIL APPROVAL OF APPOINTMENT	Yes
COMPENSATION	Members shall serve without compensation, but subject to the approval of the Mayor and within the limits imposed by the budget, they shall be allowed the necessary expenses attendant upon their duties.
TERM OF APPOINTMENT	3 years and until successors are appointed and qualified. Members shall be eligible for reappointment for additional terms.
VACANCY APPOINTMENT	When a vacancy occurs on the Human Relations Commission-Advocacy other than as a result of the expiration of the term of appointment, the Mayor shall have the right to fill that vacancy for the unexpired term. Members shall be eligible for reappointment for additional terms.

REMOVAL	Members are subject to removal by the Mayor at the discretion of the Mayor.
POWERS	The Human Relations Commission-Advocacy shall endeavor to promote and
