Describe Agency's Vision, Mission and Services:

Our Mission: In the spirit of Catherine Spalding and the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, Presentation Academy strives to create a diverse community that promotes academic excellence and challenges young women to develop their greatest potential as leaders in a global society.

A Catholic, college-preparatory high school for girls, Presentation Academy emphasizes excellence in academics, leadership and personal development.

Located in zip code 40203 in the south Fourth Street corridor (District 4), Presentation serves economically distressed areas of Louisville so that young women who do not have access geographically and economically to attend a private, Catholic school can do so. We welcome students from all faith traditions.

Our mission includes serving all socio-economic groups. Half of students receive financial aid, a third are from financially distressed households in zip codes with median incomes less than \$40,000. Students include those that come from zip codes that rank in bottom 10% in nation for median income. As a result, Presentation has a diverse student body, and is propelling young women out of the cycle of poverty through education.

The school is staffed with a President responsible for operations and fundraising, a Principal directing the academic and extra-curricular programs along with 35 faculty and 20 staff.

The President of the school is accountable to a 14-member Board of Trustees, and reports to a three member Foundation Board. 100% of board members give to the Annual Campaign. The school operating budget for 2015-16 is \$3,400,000.

The Tower Awards is an annual mission-driven event honoring women leaders in their fields and highlighting contributions and talents of these role models to our students and the Louisville community. This year's event with expected attendance of 600 is Thursday, October 8, 2015 from 6-9 p.m. at the Louisville Marriott Downtown.

This year we will celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the Tower Awards honoring women leaders who have forged new paths in our community. On this night we will celebrate this year's recipients along with all past honorees. The Tower Awards evolved from Presentation Academy's innovative Leadership Program. Students have the opportunity to engage with Tower Award Winners through job shadowing, mentorships, and classroom speaker series. Since its inception in 1995, Presentation Academy has recognized over 100 deserving women in the categories of Arts & Communication, Business, Technology & Trade, Education, Government & Law, Science & Healthcare, and Service & Advocacy.

The Tower Awards event generates funds for scholarships for young women from economically disadvantaged households who desire the benefits of a college preparatory, high school education. Full scholarships are not awarded; instead the school works with families and students to use a combination of payments, work study and financial aid/scholarships.

Presentation is the only Catholic high school located in downtown Louisville and near distressed neighborhoods. We offer geographic and financial access. The purpose of the scholarship program is to provide a Catholic education for at-risk girls, promote their opportunity for college attainment and to break the cycle of poverty through education.

Besides financial aid, Presentation is committed to ensuring ALL students thrive. We provide support with personalized learning, social support counseling, loaner IPads and practical services that help students be successful in a college preparatory environment. As a result, 100% of Presentation students qualify to go onto post-secondary institutions and earn an average of \$50,000 in college scholarships annually.

Nearly half of Presentation students qualify for financial aid. Students include those from socio-economically disadvantaged households - typically from west and south Louisville from zip codes 40203, 40208, 40210 and 40215 where the median incomes (\$13,458 to \$24,041) rank in the bottom 10% of the nation. Students include African American, Hispanic and other ethnic backgrounds. We welcome students from all faith traditions. The 2014-15 school year had 279 students enrolled representing 44 different zip codes.

F: Briefly describe any existing collaborative relationships the organization has with other community organizations. Describe what those partners are bringing to the relationship in general and to this program/project specifically.

KentuckyOne Health is the lead event sponsor for the 20th Anniversary event, and dozens of corporate, community and individual donors have contributed sponsorship funds.

Whittenberg Construction, Anderson, Bryant Lasky & Winslow (accounting firm), the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, Norton Healthcare and Brown-Forman are examples of long standing partners for this event.

Additionally, nearly 100 alumnae, students and community volunteers have contributed their time and talent to organize and execute this event.

Form 5578 is due annually by the 15th day of the 5th month following the end of the organization's accounting period.





ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

PRESENTATION ACADEMY, INC.

The undersigned Incorporator, Spalding University, Inc., executes these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming and does hereby form a non-stock, non-profit corporation under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (KRS 273.161 et seq.), in accordance with the following provisions:

Article I

Name of the Corporation

The name of the corporation is Presentation Academy, Inc. (the "Corporation").

Article II

Purposes and Powers

The purposes for which the Corporation is formed, the business and objectives to be carried on and promoted by it, and the powers granted to it, are as follows:

- (a) The Corporation is irrevocably dedicated to and is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or its successor provision), (the "Code"). The Corporation shall receive contributions and fees, and shall distribute its funds for public, religious, charitable, educational and/or scientific purposes, as set forth in these Articles. In carrying out its corporate purposes, the Corporation shall have all the powers allowed corporations by the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Act, KRS 273.161 et seq.; provided, however, that the Corporation shall not have or exercise any power inconsistent with or prohibited by the provisions of Paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) and, if applicable, (e) of this Article II.
- (b) As limited by Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, it is expressly not the purpose of the Corporation and the Corporation is not empowered to participate or intervene in (including the publication or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. If Section 4945 of the Code is applicable to the Corporation, the Corporation is not empowered to attempt to influence legislation or carry on propaganda within the meaning of Section 4945(e) of the Code. If Section 4945 of the Code is not applicable to the Corporation, the Corporation shall not devote more than an insubstantial part of its activities to carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

- (c) Any other provision of these Articles to the contrary notwithstanding, the Corporation shall have no capital stock and no power to issue certificates of stock nor to declare dividends; no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual; and the Corporation shall not carry on any activities denied to: [i] a corporation described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, including activities prohibited by Section 501(m) of the Code; or [ii] a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code.
- (d) In furtherance of, consistent with and subject to the general and controlling purposes and limitations set forth in this Article II, the Corporation shall have the following particular purpose: to own, operate, manage and promote Presentation Academy, a Catholic school in Louisville, Kentucky.
- (e) Any other provision of these Articles to the contrary notwithstanding, the Corporation shall, if the following provisions of law are applicable to it: [i] not engage in any act of self dealing as defined in Section 4941 of the Code; [ii] distribute its income for each fiscal year at such time and in such manner as not to be subject to the tax under Section 4942 of the Code; [iii] not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943 of the Code; [iv] not make any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code; and [v] not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945 of the Code.

Article III

Registered Office and Agent

Principal Office

Article V

Board of Trustees

The affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of no fewer than three (3) members, the exact number, and the manner in which they are elected or removed, to be established in the Bylaws of the Corporation. Article VI

Members

The Corporation shall not have members.

Article VII

Dissolution

Dissolution shall be accomplished in accordance with Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes or its successor provision. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all corporate assets by distributing such assets to Spalding University (so long as Spalding University remains organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes and at that time qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or its successor provision.) In the event Spalding University is unable or unwilling to accept all or a portion of such assets, then such assets or portion thereof shall be distributed to one or more organizations that are organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes and at that time qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or its successor provision. If possible, the purposes of such charitable donee or donees should be substantially similar to the charitable purposes of the Corporation. Any such assets not so disposed of by the Board of Trustees shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the County in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes and shall, at that time, qualify as tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or its successor provision. If possible, the Court shall cause such remaining assets to be transferred to a donee or donees that have purposes that are substantially similar to the charitable purposes of the Corporation.

Article VIII

Limitation of Trustee Liability

No Trustee shall be personally liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for breach of his or her duties as a Trustee except for liability:

- A. For any transaction in which the Trustee's personal financial interest is in conflict with the financial interests of the Corporation;
- B. For acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or are known to the Trustee to be a violation of law; or
- C. For any transaction from which the Trustee derives an improper personal benefit.

If the Kentucky Revised Statutes are amended after approval of this Article to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors, then the liability of a Trustee of the Corporation shall be deemed to be eliminated or limited by this

provision to the fullest extent then permitted by the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as so amended. Any repeal or modification of this Article shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a Trustee of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.

Article IX

Amendment

The Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation may be amended in the manner provided by law; provided however, that Article VII may not be amended.

Article X

Indemnification

Each person who is or was a member, trustee, officer or director of the Corporation, whether elected or appointed, and each person who is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a member, trustee, officer or director of another corporation, whether elected or appointed, or of a partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, including service with respect to employee benefit plans, including the heirs, executors, administrators or estate of any such person, shall be indemnified by the Corporation to the full amount against any liability, and the reasonable cost, or expense (including attorneys' fees, monetary or other judgments, fines, excise taxes or penalties and amounts paid or to be paid in settlement) incurred by such person in such person's capacity as a member, trustee, officer, director or employee or arising out of such person's status as a member, trustee, officer, director or employee; provided, however, no such person shall be indemnified against any such liability, cost or expense incurred in connection with any action, suit or proceeding in which such person shall have been adjudged liable on the basis that personal benefit was improperly received by such person or if such indemnification would be prohibited by law. Such right shall be a contract right and shall include the right to be paid by the Corporation the reasonable expenses incurred in defending any threatened or pending action, suit or proceeding in advance of its final disposition; provided, however, that such advance payments of expenses shall be made only after delivery to the Corporation of an undertaking by or on behalf of such person to repay all amounts so advanced if it shall be determined that such person is not entitled to such indemnification. Any repeal or modification of this Article shall not affect any rights or obligations then existing. If any indemnification payment required by this Article is not paid by the Corporation within ninety (90) days after a written claim has been received by the Corporation, the member, trustee, officer, director or employee may at any time thereafter bring suit against the Corporation to recover the unpaid amount and, if successful in whole or in part, shall be entitled to be paid also the expense of prosecuting such claim. The Corporation may maintain insurance, at its own expense, to protect itself and any such person against any such liability, cost or expense, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability, cost or expense under the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Act or under this Article, but it shall not be obligated to do so. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed

exclusive of any other rights which those seeking indemnification may have or hereafter acquire under any bylaw, agreement, statute, vote of members or Board of Trustees or otherwise. If this Article or any portion thereof shall be invalidated on any ground by any court of competent jurisdiction, then the Corporation shall nevertheless indemnify each such person, to the full extent permitted by any applicable portion of this Article that shall not have been invalidated or by any other applicable law. For the purpose of this Article, reference to "the Corporation" includes all constituents absorbed in a consolidation or merger as well as the resulting or surviving corporation.

Article XI


