KLEC Certified Curriculums Development:

- **Verbal Advantage** – This course of instruction was taught to all members of the Louisville Police Department. The course outlined the history of racism in America. It also looked at how Law Enforcement was used to enforce laws that created a lack of trust between African Americans and Law Enforcement during segregation. The goal of the course was to provide officers with the verbal tools and knowledge that would help them during their interactions with the public.
- **In-Car Mobile Video** – After merger, the Louisville Metro Police Department purchased In-Car Video Cameras for all officers in the patrol divisions. This course was developed to certify all patrol officers in three areas: an overview of the video system, the benefits of in-car video cameras in law enforcement vehicles and the agency policy on in-car video systems.
