I hope this finds you well. We are starting to plan the 2014 Urban Wilderness Canoe Adventure – aka “Canoemobile” event scheduled for the first weekend in October in Riverview Park. I wanted to reach out to you, as I have with CW Hamilton, to see if you have interest in supporting the event this year. I can say that last year’s event was on-schedule to exceed the initial year when we got caught in the freakish 6” rain deluge. We have every expectation that, weather permitting, this year’s event will continue to see growth.

Below is the budget that we have identified for the event this year. You’ll notice that it is less than last year. We are in the process of returning unused funds from last years to the council members who contributed.
