

LFD Overview

- **425** Personnel, **399** Uniformed/Sworn
- 44 New Recruits started May 17, 26-Week Class
- **366** Emergency Medical Technicians; **13** Paramedics
- **399** Hazardous Materials Technicians
- Largest LFD Bureau: **Fire Suppression/Operations**
- **21 Fire Stations**
- **26 Fire Companies** (Fire Apparatus with Crew)
- Divided into **Four (4) Districts or Battalions**
- Suppression Personnel work a **24-Hour shift**, followed by 48 hours off (3 Platoons)

- First Responders; Triage, Treat, Stabilize
- All Fire Units equipped with Defibrillators and Medical Equipment

Fire Suppression & Operations



Structure Fire Response

- Structure Fire – 4 Engines, 2 Trucks or Quints, 1 Battalion Chief
- 24 Hour Safety Chief
- 24 Hour Assistant Chief
- Extra Engine and Extra Truck, also get additional Battalion Chief
- Level 1 RIT unless 1st Alarm Exceeded, then Level 2 RIT (Rapid Intervention Team)




