

LFD Overview

- **498** Personnel, (424) are Emergency Medical Technicians; (14) are Paramedics
- Largest Bureau: **Fire Suppression/Operations**
- **21 Fire Stations**
- **27 Fire Companies** (Fire Apparatus with Crew)
- Divided into **Four (4) Districts or Battalions**
- Suppression Personnel work a **24 Hour shift**, followed by 48 hours off

- Emergency Medical First Response
- Three (3) Hazardous Materials Engines
- Water Rescue/Dive Team/ Fireboat
- 10 Inflatable Rescue Boats
- Heavy Urban Search & Rescue
- Collapse, Trench, Confined Space Rescue
- High Angle Rope Rescue
- Four (4) Utility All-Terrain Vehicles

2016 LFD Run Statistics

- **37,363** Total Incidents (increase)
- **23,958** Emergency Medical Incidents
- **13,419** Fire Incidents
- **51,367** Individual Unit Responses
- **244** Runs in Shively, Automatic Aid
- **424** Working Structure Fires
- **583** Arson Investigations (342 LFD, 241 Suburban Fire)
- Emergency Medical (64%) Fire Incidents (36%)






