Class 1 ISO Rating

- Last site visit was in 1974, Relative Class 1
- Effective May 1, 2015 LFD is Class 1 ISO
- Less than 100 Fire Departments are Class 1 ISO out of 48,000 jurisdictions.
- LFD rating was based solely on our department without any mutual aid or automatic aid from other departments.

CFAI Accreditation

- **Commission on Fire Accreditation International**
- Accredited August 14, 2014
- Only **196 Fire Departments** in U.S. and Canada achieved Accreditation
- Five Year Accreditation
- Annual Reports on Progress



LFD Overview

- 508 Personnel, (400+) are Emergency Medical Technicians
- 21 Fire Stations
- 27 Fire Companies
- Divided into 4 Districts or Battalions
- All Hazards Response
- Suppression works a 24 Hour shift, 48 hours off
- Also Provide Fire Protection to (6) Sixth Class Cities

- **244** Runs in Shively, Automatic Aid



- Quick Fill Quick Change Features




Quint 10 on Order, Delivery in Fall 2015
