






Replacing/repairing 6.4 miles of main



Phase 1: Nov 2016 – April 2017





Slip Lining & Push Pull Pits


- Slip a new 42-inch diameter steel pipeline inside the existing 48-inch cast iron main
- Approximately 70% of the route will not be disturbed, significantly minimizing the disruptions of lane closures and detours





What to Expect

- Start construction at Beargrass Creek and move east toward Cherokee Park
- Work hours Mon – Fri 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.
- Work on intersections will be 24 hours
- Light towers at job sites
- Lighted road closure signs
- Typical construction site noise
- Fencing and barriers around open construction pits





What to Expect

- Contractor plans to have two staging areas:
 - Eastern Parkway & Beargrass
 - Cherokee golf course, parking near Grinstead
- Restoration plans: backfill to surface with concrete, once entire phase complete will repave disturbed areas curb-to-curb



Tree Removal / Replacement

- Worked with Metro Parks on plan for tree removal and replacement
- Up to 50 trees could be removed
- At minimum, two trees replanted for every one removed
- Goal is to save as many trees as possible through flexibility of push/pull pit locations
- Metro Parks will replant new trees of their selected variety and number



Preliminary Traffic Phases

- Seven phases in phase one
 - Four along Eastern Pkwy (Beargrass Creek to Willow Ave)
 - Three along Willow Ave and Cherokee Pkwy
- Lane closure(s) and detour routes
- Phases will last anywhere from several days to several weeks



Sample Traffic Plan



- Letter mailed mid-September to all homeowners/businesses to explain overall project
- Detailed media briefing prior to start of project
- Frequent updates to council members
- Updates to neighborhood and business associations
