WE LOST 15 MEMBERS OF OUR LOUISVILLE FAMILY LAST WEEK
DUE TO COVID, 471 NEW CASES OF COVID
HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN THE LAST WEEK.
AS WE GIVE THANKS FOR THE DECREASE IN NUMBERS,
PLEASE KEEP THE FAMILIES OF THOSE
THAT HAVE BEEN TOUCHED BY COVID,
IN YOUR THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS,
AND I ASK THAT THAT WE ALSO KEEP
THE THOUGHTS OF THE FAMILIES
IN THE UKRAINE AND OUR THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS.
AND WITH THAT, I'LL ASK FOR A MOMENT OF SILENCE.

WHEREAS THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE,
SMALL COED CHEER SQUAD HAS WON
12 NATIONAL DANCE ASSOCIATION,
NATIONAL CHEER ASSOCIATION COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS.
AND WHEREAS THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE
SMALL COED CHEER SQUAD ATTENDED THE NCA/NDA
NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS IN DAYTONA BEACH, FLORIDA,
FROM APRIL THE SIXTH, 2022, THROUGH APRIL THE 10TH, 2022.
AND WHEREAS AT THE 2022 NDA/NCA COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIP,
THE LOUISVILLE SMALL COED CHEER SQUAD
EARNED A SCORE OF 96.294.

WE LOVE YOU TOO.
ALL RIGHT, SO AS WE KNOW,
YOU GUYS MADE IT TO THE FINAL FOUR AND WE WERE ALL
ON THE EDGE OF OUR SEATS CHEERING FOR YOU.
SO THAT'S AN ACCOMPLISHMENT AND WE WANTED TO RECOGNIZE THAT
AND SAY, THANK YOU FOR ALL THE HARD WORK.
AND WE AT THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE LOVE YOU ALL,
AND WE HAVE A PROCLAMATION FOR YOU ALL.
AND THIS IS WHAT IT SAYS,

IN THE 2022 NCAA BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL FOUR.
AND WHEREAS THE LOUISVILLE CARDINAL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM
FINISHED THE SEASON WITH A 29 AND FIVE RECORD,
TYING THE FIFTH MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY WHILE REACHING
THE SWEET 16 FOR THE FIFTH STRAIGHT TOURNAMENT,
THE ELITE EIGHT FOR THE FOURTH STRAIGHT TOURNAMENT,
AND THE FINAL FOUR FOR THE FOURTH TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY.
AND WHEREAS DURING HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ'S 15 YEAR TENURE,
EVERY FOUR YEAR PLAYER HAS PLAYED IN A FINAL FOUR
AND WITH FOUR FINAL FOURS SINCE 2009,
THE CARDINALS ARE TIED FOR THE FOURTH MOST IN THE COUNTRY.
AND WHEREAS THE CARDINALS FINISHED WITH A PERFECT 16
AND A RECORD AT HOME, MAKING THE FIRST TIME
IN PROGRAM HISTORY,
THEY HAVE FINISHED UNDEFEATED AT THE KFC YUM! CENTER
AND THEIR CURRENT 18 GAME HOME WINNING STREAK
IS THE LONGEST IN PROGRAM HISTORY.
AND WE HEREBY HONOR AND CONFER WITH ALL THE RIGHTS,
PRIVILEGES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES
THERE INTO PERTAINING IN TESTIMONY
WHERE WE HAVE CAUSED THESE LETTERS TO BE MADE IN THE SEAL
OF THE LOUISVILLE METRO GOVERNMENT TO BE HERE,
A FIX DONE IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY,

OF YOUNG WOMEN WHO REPRESENT OUR UNIVERSITY.
I SAY IT ALL THE TIME,
I'M HONORED AND BLESSED TO COACH HERE AT THE UNIVERSITY
AND TO COACH THESE WONDERFUL PEOPLE.
NOT ONLY ARE THEY GREAT BASKETBALL PLAYERS,
BUT I PROMISE YOU, THEY REPRESENT OUR CITY, OUR UNIVERSITY,
THEIR FAMILIES, IN THE UTMOST HIGHEST HONOR WAY

BASKETBALL TEAMS, THAT'S NOT TOO BAD.
SO THANK YOU AGAIN, I'M GONNA LET MARCASA
SAY A FEW WORDS AND ANYBODY ELSE WHO WOULD LIKE TO.

MY NAME IS SAVANNAH WINSTON AND I AM A PART OF THE
EVICTION PREVENTION TEAM WITH
THE COALITION FOR THE HOMELESS.
MY JOB IS TO INFORM THOSE AT RISK OF BEING EVICTED
ABOUT PROGRAMS AVAILABLE IN LOUISVILLE.
I WITNESSED MY FIRST EVICTION
WHEN I WAS LESS THAN 10 YEARS OLD,
AND A NEIGHBORHOOD I GREW UP IN,
THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY WAS RAVING ABOUT A FAMILY
WHOSE WHOLE LIVELIHOOD HAD BEEN REMOVED FROM THEIR HOME
AND PLACED IN THEIR YARD.
ITEMS THAT WERE ONCE TREASURES TO ONE FAMILY
WERE BEING PICKED THROUGH
AND TAKEN IN AS TREASURES FOR ANOTHER.
I HAD NO IDEA WHAT WAS GOING ON AS AN EIGHT YEAR OLD,
BUT OVER A DECADE LATER, THINGS CAME FULL CIRCLE

WHEN I HAD TO KNOCK ON A DOOR ON THAT EXACT SAME STREET.
RETURNING TO THE SITE OF THIS CHILDHOOD MEMORY
IS SOMETHING I WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER.
WITH THE HEAVY HEART, I WONDERED IF THAT FAMILY,
ALL THOSE YEARS AGO,
WOULD'VE BEEN ABLE TO STAY IN THEIR HOME
IF SOMEONE LIKE ME HAD KNOCKED ON THEIR DOOR WITH OPTIONS.
FOR THE PAST 11 MONTHS, I WITH MY COLLEAGUES, RAY, CHARLIE,
AND CAITLIN HAVE KNOCKED ON ALMOST 8,000 DOORS.
WE HAVE HEARD STORIES OF KENTUCKY AND STRUGGLING TO PAY RENT
AFTER THEIR HOURS WERE CUT AT WORK.
WE HAVE WITNESSED DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS WITH LEAKING ROOFS,
FAULTY ELECTRIC, AND SAGGING FOUNDATIONS.
AND WE HAVE STOOD ON PORCHES WITH PEOPLE
WHO WERE TRAUMATIZED BY LANDLORDS
WILLING TO TURN OFF UTILITIES OR REMOVE LOCKS ON THE DOOR
TO FORCE THEM TO MOVE.
EVICTIONS ARE NOT A FUTURE OF THE PANDEMIC.
YOU ALL HAVE HEARD ARE THE STATISTICS COUNTLESS TIMES.
SO FOR THE SAKE OF TIME, I WILL NOT BE REPEATING THEM TODAY,
BUT WE NEED TO BE ASKING OURSELVES WHY ARE RATE OF EVICTIONS
FILED WERE TWO TIMES THE NATIONAL AVERAGE,
EVEN PRIOR TO 2020.
RENTING IS AN EXERCISE OF NAVIGATING A SYSTEM (INDISTINCT)
WITH ABUSE WITH MANY PITFALLS
AND KENTUCKIANS ARE A CRISIS AWAY FROM HOMELESSNESS.
SO SIMPLY PUT, LOW INCOME TENANTS DO NOT HAVE ANY POWER.
BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE STATE
AND THE LACK OF PROTECTIONS,
TENANTS ARE FORCED INTO BAD AND UNSUSTAINABLE RENTING
SITUATIONS WITH LANDLORDS WHO PROVIDE SUBSTANDARD CONDITIONS
AT EXTREMELY HIGH RENTS.
I HOPE AND WORK FOR A KENTUCKY WHERE EVERY PERSON CAN WORK,
WORSHIP, RAISE A FAMILY AND EXIST VIBRANT COMMUNITIES,
REGARDLESS OF IF THEY RUN THEIR HOME.
TO GET TO THIS FUTURE,
WE MUST WORK TO ADDRESS DEEP ROOTED SYSTEMIC ISSUES
IN OUR RENTAL MARKET.
WHILE MY TEAM AND I ARE DOING OUR PART
IN ENSURING YOUR CONSTITUENTS HAVE A PLACE TO STAY,
WHAT WE DO IS ONLY A BANDAID TO THE BIGGER ROOT PROBLEM.
I ASK THAT METRO COUNCIL CONTINUE TO FOCUS ON HOUSING
IN THE UPCOMING BUDGET DISCUSSIONS.
WE NEED TO CONTINUE THE HARD WORK FROM PAST YEAR
TO MEET THIS CRITICAL NEED.
PLEASE RENEW AND FUND THE RIGHT TO COUNSEL ORDINANCES,

FUND THE CREATION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING
THROUGH THE TRUST FUND,
AND WORK TO SUPPORT LOW INCOME RENTERS WITH LEGISLATION
THAT WILL CORRECT THE UNJUST POWER IMBALANCES
IN THE RENTAL MARKET.

FINALLY, I WOULD LIKE TO CLOSE BY ECHOING AND EMPHASIZING
THE NEED TO ADDRESS THE FAILURES
OF LOW METRO CORRECTIONS TO KEEP EIGHT OF ITS OCCUPANTS
SAFE AND ALIVE.

NOT ONLY IS IT IMPERATIVE THAT THOSE RESPONSIBLE
ARE HELD ACCOUNTABLE,
BUT WE MUST ALSO ADDRESS OLD BENCH WARRANTS
THAT FOLLOW THOSE FACING HOMELESSNESS.
WE NEED TO TAKE A STAND AND DO BETTER. THANK YOU.

TONIGHT I WISH I COULD INTRODUCE YOU TO MICHAEL.

I WANNA TELL YOU HOW IN THE SPRING OF 2021,

HE TOLD ME HE WANTED TO GET CLEAN,

BUT HE KNEW WHAT WOULD AND WOULD NOT WORK FOR HIM

AND HE NEEDED MEDICATION ASSISTED RECOVERY.

HOW HARD HE WORKED TO GET TO A PLACE WHERE HE TAPERED
HIS USE JUST TO STAY WELL AND NOT GET HIGH.

I WANT TO TELL YOU HOW MUCH PRIDE HE TOOK IN HIS APARTMENT,
FILLING IT WITH HIS OWN ARTWORK AND ALWAYS KEEPING IT
TASTEFULLY DECORATED AND CLEAN,

DESPITE A NECK INJURY THAT PARALYZED HIS EXTREMITIES.

I WANT TO TELL YOU HOW IMPORTANT HE WAS TO HIS COMMUNITY

AS A FORMER NURSE HE NARCANNED 60 PEOPLE,

HIS LAST SUMMER CAMPING BEFORE ENTERING OUR PROGRAM.

HOW HIS FRIENDS KNEW TO SEEK HIM IN HIS APARTMENT OUT

AND HOW ONE SOUGHT HIM OUT LAST MAY

WHEN SHE GOT OUT OF THE HOSPITAL, RIGHT AFTER AN OVERDOSE,

AND HOW SHE PASSED AWAY WHILE MICHAEL WAS ASLEEP.

HOW MICHAEL DID THE RIGHT THING

AND IMMEDIATELY CALLED 911,

AND THEN WAS ARRESTED ON A TWO YEAR OLD BENCH WARRANT,

RIGHT AFTER THE TRAUMA OF WAKING UP

TO FIND HIS FRIEND DECEASED.

I WISH I COULD INTRODUCE YOU TO MICHAEL TONIGHT,

BUT THE TRAUMA OF INCARCERATION IN THE MIDST OF A PANDEMIC
TRIGGERED A RAPID DISSENT INTO A CYCLE OF MORE USE
UNTIL HE RETURNED TO THE STREET
AND POLICE ARRESTED HIM ONCE AGAIN ON THE SAME OLD WARRANT.
DESPITE OUR BEST EFFORTS,
MICHAEL WENT FROM STRIVING TO OVERCOME THE MANY BARRIERS
TO ACCESSING MEDICATION ASSISTED RECOVERY,
TO LOSING ALL HOPE AND DYING OF AN OVERDOSE
WITHIN DAYS OF LEAVING JAIL FOR THE SECOND TIME.
I'D ASK COUNCIL THESE QUESTIONS,
WHAT PUBLIC GOOD WAS SERVED LOCKING MICHAEL UP?
WHAT PUBLIC GOOD WAS LOST NOW THAT MICHAEL IS GONE?
AT WHAT POINT DO WE STOP CARING ABOUT JUSTICE
AND ONLY CARE ABOUT PUNISHMENT?
19% OF 2019 ARRESTS MADE BY POLICE IN LOUISVILLE
WERE SOLELY BECAUSE THE PERSON
HAD AN OUTSTANDING BENCH WARRANT.
LOUISVILLE ISSUED 46,000 BENCH WARRANTS IN 2018.
PEOPLE WHO ARE HOMELESS ARE 11 TIMES MORE LIKELY
TO BE ARRESTED NATIONWIDE THAN THOSE WHO ARE HOUSED.
I ASK THAT METRO COUNCIL PROACTIVELY SUPPORT
LOUISVILLIANS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS BY FUNDING HOUSING,
AND I SUPPORT ADDRESSING THIS PLETHORA
OF OLD BENCH WARRANTS, THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

WHO TREATS ADULTS LIVING WITH MENTAL ILLNESS.

IN THE PAST, I'VE WORKED DIRECTLY TO SUPPORT PEOPLE

AS THEY NAVIGATE THE ROAD BACK TO HOUSING FROM HOMELESS.

I'VE LISTENED TO ENOUGH STORIES TO KNOW HOW MANY HURDLES

OUR NEIGHBORS MUST OVERCOME

TO FINALLY HAVE A PLACE TO CALL THEIR OWN.

THE MAJORITY OF MY CLIENTS NOW ARE LIVING IN POVERTY.

THE LUCKY ONES HAVE SUBSIDIZED HOUSING

BASED ON THEIR INCOME,

BUT MY UNLUCKY CLIENTS PAY MORE THAN 30% OF THEIR INCOME

WHILE WORKING LOW WAGE JOBS OR LIVING ON A FIXED INCOME.

THESE FOLKS LIVE ON THE EDGE OF EVICTION EACH MONTH

AND MUST MAKE TOUGH CHOICES TO GET BY.

IN KENTUCKY 62% OF EXTREMELY LOW INCOME HOUSEHOLDS

PAY MORE THAN 50% OF THEIR INCOME IN HOUSING.

THESE ARE THE ONES I WORRY MOST ABOUT
BECAUSE THEY DO NOT HAVE A SAFETY NET.
THE WAITING LIST FOR HOUSING PROGRAMS
CAN BE THREE TO FOUR YEARS LONG, TOO LONG TO WAIT.
FOR PEOPLE LIVING ON A FIXED INCOME,
ONE EMERGENCY CAN LEAD TO EVICTION,
ONE STREAK OF BAD LUCK CAN LEAD TO HOMELESSNESS.
FOR EXAMPLE, A RELATIONSHIP BREAKUP, A JOB LOSS,
A RELAPSE, CAR TROUBLE, OR HEALTH ISSUES
CAN START A DOWNWARD SPIRAL.
THE PROBLEMS ARE ONLY COMPOUNDED WHEN SOMEONE IS TRYING
TO MAINTAIN THEIR MENTAL HEALTH WHILE AT THE SAME TIME,
MAINTAIN THEIR HOUSING.
WITHOUT HOUSING, THERE IS NO PLACE
TO SAFELY STORE MEDICINES,
TO HAVE A ROUTINE, TO REST, AND FEEL SAFE ENOUGH TO SLEEP.
LOUISVILLE NEEDS MORE HOUSING FOR THOSE LIVING ON THE EDGE.
WE NEED 31,000 UNITS OF AFFORDABLE RENTALS
FOR THE POOREST HOUSEHOLDS.
IN THIS UPCOMING LOUISVILLE METRO BUDGET,
I ASK THAT YOU CONTINUE TO CENTER HOUSING FOR THOSE
THAT EARN THE LEAST AND MAKE IT THE FOUNDATION
THAT OUR COMMUNITY IS BUILT ON.
I URGE THE METRO COUNCIL TO FUND THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING
TRUST FUND WITH 10 MILLION DOLLARS,
RENEW FUNDING FOR LOUISVILLE'S RIGHT TO COUNCIL ORDINANCE,
SUPPORT LOW INCOME RENTERS FACING EVICTION
WITH ROBUST SUPPORTS AND SERVICES
TO HELP OF THEM AVOID HOMELESSNESS,
AND CONTINUE TO FUND HOMELESS SERVICES AND OUTREACH WORK.
I ALSO WOULD LIKE TO REITERATE THE CALLS FOR ATTENTION
TO THE EIGHT DEATHS IN THE LOCAL JAIL.
WE NEED GREATER TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY, REFORMS,
