HOMELESS STATS IN LOUISVILLE

ANNUAL HOMELESS STREET COUNT RESULTS (COUNT CONDUCTED BY COALITION FOR THE HOMELESS ON JAN. 31, 2019)

- ◆ 118 individuals were counted sleeping outside, compared to 153 counted in January 2018. This represents a 23% decrease in the number of people sleeping outdoors.

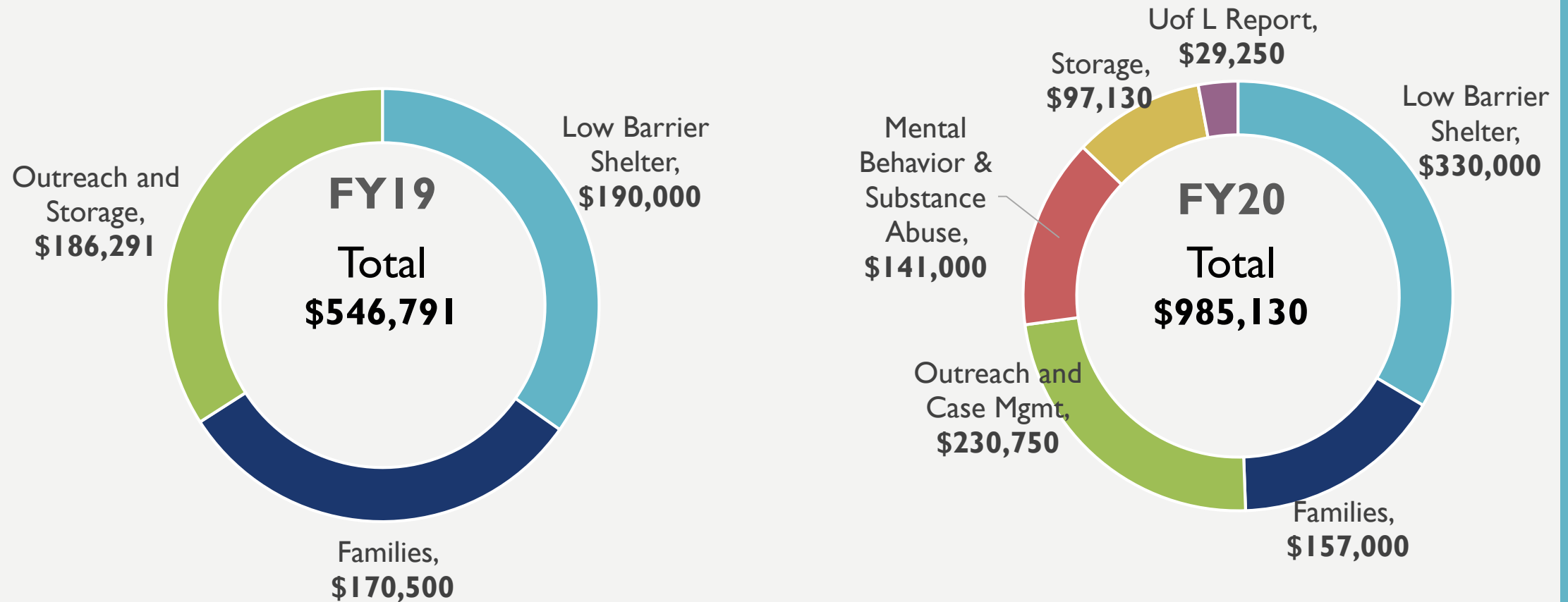

2018 LOUISVILLE HOMELESS CENSUS (RELEASED ON APRIL 19, 2019 BY THE COALITION FOR THE HOMELESS)

- ◆ Advocates and outreach teams provided services to 6,986 unduplicated homeless people between October 1, 2017 and September 30, 2018, which was a 4.3% increase from the 6,695 served in the previous year.
- ◆ The number of unsheltered people served throughout 2018 decreased by 18% from 774 to 632. The number of sheltered individuals served increased by 7.3% from 5,921 to 6,354.
