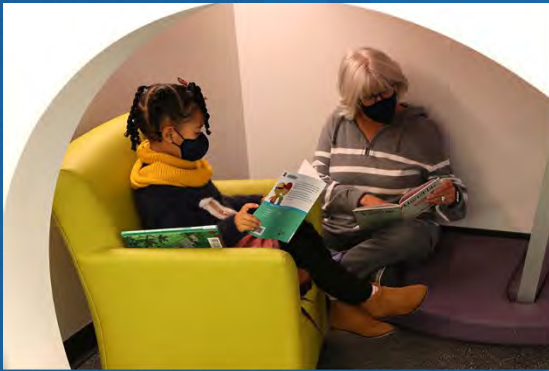




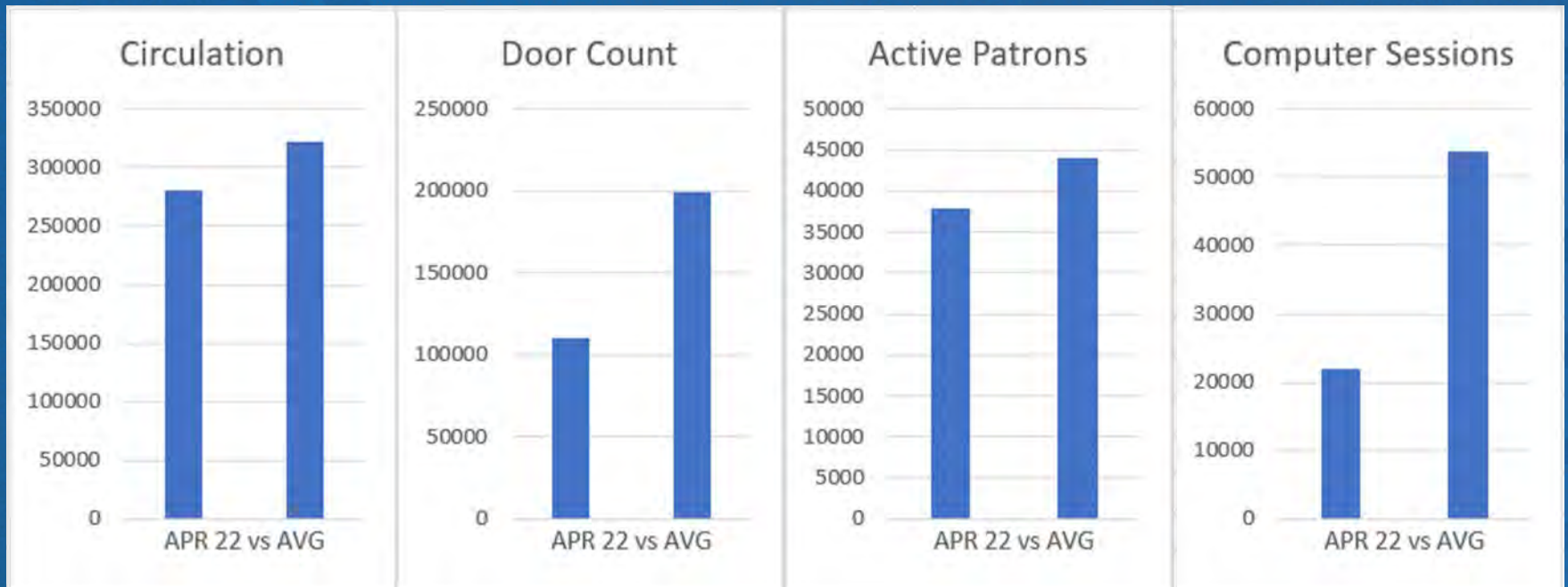

Where We Stand Today:

- Great news about capital projects
- Staffing challenges
- Operational funding challenges
- The Gap: State Standards, National Averages, and Benchmarks

State Standard for Square Footage

- 0.6sf per capita is the state Minimum Standard
- Enhanced is 0.8sf and Exemplary is 1.0sf
- LFPL is currently at 0.54sf
- Proposed ARP projects will get us to 0.57sf
- To meet the state standard by 2030 we will need to add 62,000sf in addition to the 4 proposed projects



Peer City Comparison

- Louisville ranks **84th** out of 116 in library spending *per capita* among libraries serving 400,000 people or more.*
