Team Street Safe runs parallel with the Neighborhood Block Watch Program. It consists of individuals that gather for the common good of the neighborhoods and want to partnership with police. The 4th Division is the only division in the city to incorporate the walks with the community. The members will pick an area, and along with officers, will walk. This initiative is a valuable tool. Although it appears like a social gathering, beneficial information is obtained. During the walks, crime prevention pamphlets are handed out, crime tips are received and neighbors are introduced to one another. Recently, seventy-two members of Team Street Safe joined the community downtown and walked the Big Four Bridge during their crime walk. This shows solidarity and that the community has really taken hold of the program.

Police provide a reassuring presence in neighborhoods through walking the beat and focusing on proactive and preventive measures to reduce crime, enforce public safety and improve the quality of life. The citizens gather and the numbers speak volumes. It shows everyone the community is watching and will call the police.

The image of the police officer in a police car, a police car racing down the street or the distant call for help through 911 is replaced by an officer walking with community members. They are engaging with residents on the street and with the business owners and workers. The expectation is that the familiarity of their faces, their walking beat and their manner and style will lead to a more relaxed and trusting relationship with the community.

The initiative speaks of "a sense of ownership" created by the familiarity that grows quickly over time as the officers and community members build partnerships. Problem-solving and crime-prevention are enhanced.
