In accordance with the Landmarks Commission Ordinance, the Commission has appointed the following member of the **Old Louisville Architectural Review Committee (ARC)**:

By ordinance, these are Landmarks Commission, not mayoral appointments and require Metro Council approval. Also by ordinance, Committee members serve a three year term.

M. C. O. 32.253 (C) *"Each Committee shall consist of seven members, one of whom shall be the Director of the Department of Codes and Regulations or his or her designee, two members shall be members of the Commission appointed by the Commission Chairperson and four members who shall be appointed by the Commission and approved by the Metro Council. These four members shall serve for three year terms except they shall initially serve for one, two or three year terms as set by the Commission and shall serve until his or her successor is appointed and approved unless removed as provided herein or in the by-laws of the Committees and may be reappointed and reapproved for successive terms. These four members shall commence service at the next meeting of the Committee following the member's approval by the Metro Council. The terms of any of these four members now serving on a Committee on the effective date of this amendment shall be set by the Commission. In the case of a Committee established for a district, no fewer than two members shall be owner-residents or tenants within such district, one member shall be a real estate professional and one member shall be an architect and one member shall be the owner of income producing property located within the district. All members shall have a known interest in local landmarks districts preservation."*

Work History and Skills

My work experiences and skills are primarily professionally military oriented as I served 28 years in the United States Air Force. The traditional resume is somewhat impossible, considering my career status but that a brief biographer would suffice for this position. My first and only civilian professional job after college was a clinical dietitian with the Veterans Administration Research Hospital in Chicago, Illinois, now known as the Chicago Health System VA Research Hospital. I was employed at this institution 1961-1965.

June 1965 I advanced my professional career as a commissioned officer in the United States Air Force. Because of my special professional civilian training I was given a direct commission as a First Lieutenant and offered a position, chief and consultant dietitian.

I obtained the rank of Captain, then Major, and finally Lieutenant Colonel. In further acknowledgement of my experiences and quality of service the military awarded my position of command level presence. This enabled me to serve as senior managing dietitian in numerous military hospitals. In my role, I was responsible for the total operations of food service—staffing, equipment acquisition and maintenance, education and training of personnel, and policy setting and enforcement.

Twenty-eight years of service made Lt. Col Clark well traveled. I had tours of duty in Oklahoma, Massachusetts, Alaska, Japan, where I was the chief consultant dietitian for the entire Pacific Command, Illinois, Michigan, and two tours in Florida and finally in New Jersey, where I retired 1 July 1993.

Education and Benefits

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I attended Booker T. Washington Elementary School and Jackson Junior High School now Myzeek Middle School, graduating from Central High School in 1956.

My under graduate studies were at Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio. While there, I undertook an internship at Dayton Ohio's Miami Valley Hospital and gained field experience at both Ohio State University and Antioch College. In 1961, I graduated from college with a Bachelors of Science in Dietetics. The military in 1971 granted me the opportunity to earn a Master's degree in Institutional Management from Michigan State University (MSU).

My managerial skills will be of great benefit for the committee and the experiences will offer me an opportunity to be of service for my home state.
