Primary role is to administer to the needs of the St Rita Hispanic/Latino community with regards to religious practices/education, relocation, schools, medical resources, immigration, interpretation, translation and overall assistance to the underserved population.

St Rita Hispanic Parish Council - was part of the original Parish council, now defunct, and served as the Coordinator of the Eucharistic Ministry

Partnered with Dr Elizabeth Fitzgerald/Bellarmino University to establish Wellness Wednesdays at St Rita campus during the summer months to provide basic health tests to the Latino community, whereas they may not get elsewhere.

Partnered with Norton HealthCare to organize and facilitate groups regarding Health Equities in Louisville. Program was designated to reach out to the Latino Community and get their frank opinions about the health services, and to possibly create changes.

Coordinated with then Officer Minerva Virola/LMPD to organize and present the Latino Citizens Police Academy at St Rita. This was conducted in Spanish with law enforcement personnel instruction to Latino citizens about every aspect of the Police Department, so they could be informed about existing laws and in turn, help advocate to others.

Hosted Legal Clinics for Hispanic/Latino parishioners to keep abreast of immigration issues.

Police Academy Spanish Class. Have participated for approximately six years or better to interact with active LMPD officers, recruits, sheriff & detective personnel on a one-to-one basis to help them learn basic Spanish terms to use in their interaction and interrogation with Spanish speakers.

Applied and received a grant from Norton HealthCare for a Get Healthy year-long project targeting diet and exercise, all in Spanish. Organized talks and preparation of healthy food by a Dietician, had local farm donated produce to host preparation, cooking and clean-up classes, had Zumba and Tai-Chi instructors on board for classes

Host to both James Brown Cancer Center and Norton HealthCare for two mobile units on site to provide Cancer screenings targeting mainly the Hispanic/Latino women who normally would not be able to go elsewhere because of transportation or language barrier issues.

Organize a Hispanic/Latino work force to participate in Councilwoman Madonna Flood's Clean-Up Okolona every May. The intention was to have a Hispanic/Latino presence so we can be recognized as part of the community, however, for the last two-three years, we have succeeded in winning a monetary prize for the most participants, and publicly recognized by the Madonna Flood & the Metro Council for the years of service, with a degree sacrifice experienced by many.

Other:

Served as a Volunteer for over ten years with the Opportunity for Life organization, which is a twenty-four hour hotline for the prevention abortions by offering alternatives and pro-life practices.

Worked as an Assistant for the JCPS ESL (English as a Second Language) for over ten years at Jeffersonstown High School and Westport Middle School. Responsible for administering tests to incoming students for placement in level classes.
