

To: Honorable Angela Leet,

Thank you for being such a great Council Member and for your service to our city.

My name is Herbert Mattingly. I have lived at 2407 Rudy Lane for thirty years, Recently the roadway was repaved.

Thanks!

The old surface was only lightly milled and the new roadway is now quite a bit higher.

I now have twice the drop off at my driveway entrance. This causes me to have to slowly creep into my driveway to keep from destroying my suspension on my new van.

The public safety concern is this:

The homes on the other side of Rudy Lane face inward, not toward the roadway.

The homeowners over there have neglected for years to maintain the wild trees. Every few weeks more and more dead logs fall into the roadway and the yards adjoining. I have always dragged them off the road and disposed of them.

Friday afternoon I was waiting for traffic to allow me to safely enter my driveway from Rudy Lane, and a log fell onto the hood of my new van, causing hundreds of dollars of damage!

I pulled into my driveway and while I waited for traffic a correspond to the log and his the log and had a log fell onto the hood of my new van.

I pulled into my driveway and while I waited for traffic, a car came along and hit the log and broke it into pieces. I kicked these off the road.

I realize Metro is not liable for this damage to my van. But can Metro PLEASE do something about the deadwood overhanging Rudy Lane?

Three Bicyclists came along immediately after I removed the debris. If that log had fallen three minutes later, those men would have had a terrible wreck.

The thicket in question is behind several property's, mainly 6404 Kieth Springs Circle. I try to be a good neighbor and do not want any problems or conflicts with the owners, and have not talked to them. I asked Windy Hills about this and they are powerless, and reported sending letters to the owners that have been ignored. Its a Metro road so they will not spend money on tree removal there.

Thanks for any help or advice you can give.
