# Core Business

- Major program for former high school drop-outs or high school grads who are not in school and not working (“Opportunity Youth”)
- Funded by both federal and Louisville Metro Government dollars
- Outcomes: since 2005:
  - over 1,100 GEDs attained,
  - over 2,200 youth placed into employment,
  - over 750 enrolled in college or other post-secondary training program,
  - over 2,000 measurable learning gains on the Test of Adult Basic Education









# Right Turn Core Metrics

- More than 300 court-involved youth enrolled and served since \_\_\_\_\_
- Strong partnerships now with alternative high schools, juvenile detention center – producing many referrals of youth who can benefit from our services
- 150 youth placed into jobs
- 23 have earned high school degrees or GEDs
- 92 youth have mentors
- 99 participants in Restorative Justice projects
- 69 maintaining high school attendance through the program











# ReImage Core Metrics

- 51 participants since the program launched in the late summer, 2015
- 8 participants have already earned their high school diploma or a GED
- 18 have been placed into jobs
- 14 are currently working on Restorative Justice projects
- 17 currently enrolled in workforce education (essentials skills training, dress for success, etc.)

# The Mayor's SummerWorks Core Metrics

- 701 low-income youth prepared, placed and coached in 2015
  - 426 at private-sector companies who paid wages directly to youth
  - 275 subsidized positions funded with public and private money, youth working at non-profits (e.g. Americana) or local government (e.g. Metro Parks)
- Over 2,500 youth working overall at SummerWorks Champions like Thorntons, Norton Healthcare, Kentucky Kingdom, Krogers and others
- Plan is to keep expanding program, and to shift over time to align summer jobs more with career interests and certifications being earned while still in high school



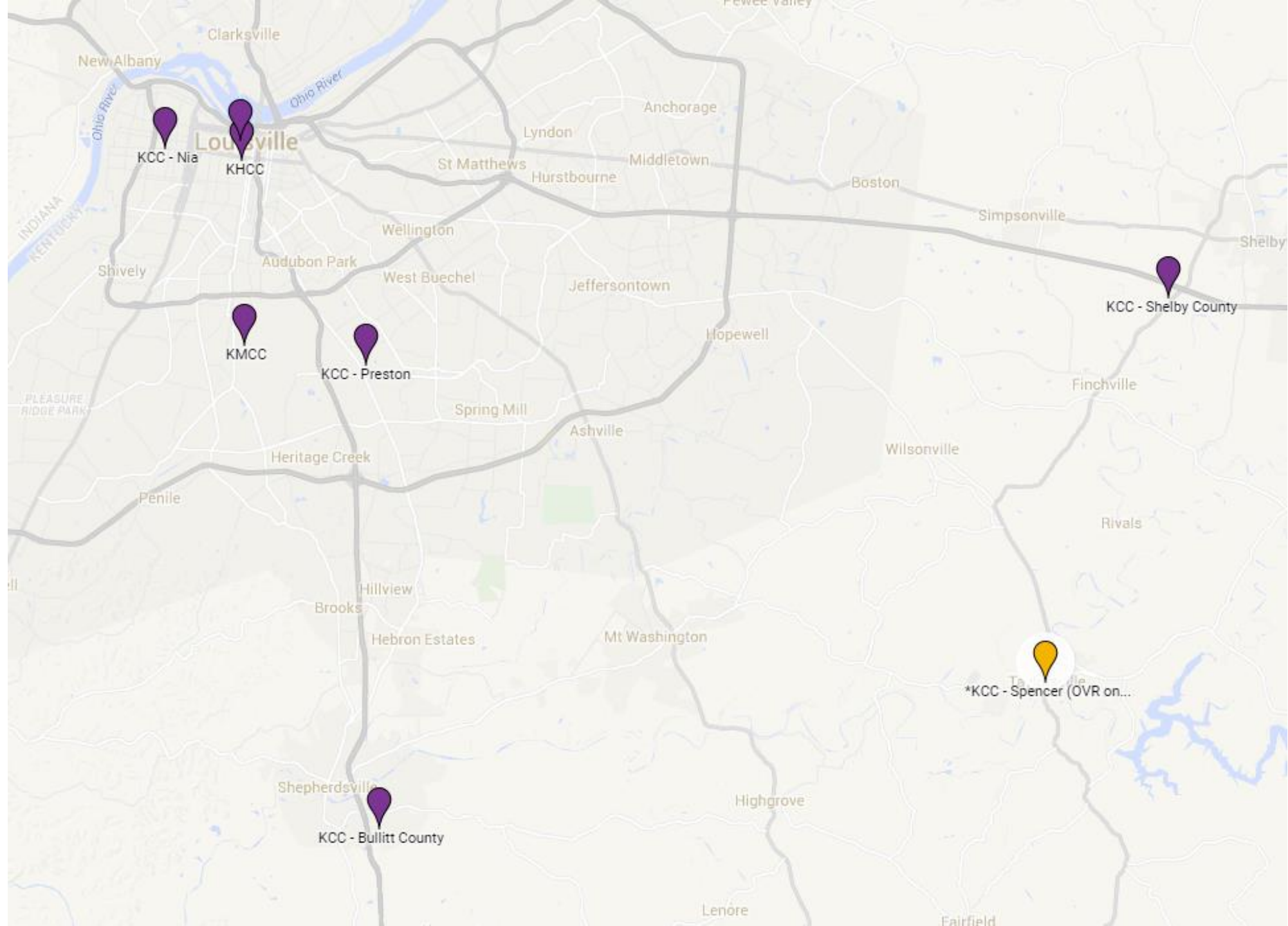

# KY Career Centers: Core Outcomes

- \$2 million in job training scholarships will be spent by June 30<sup>th</sup> for training in targeted occupations like nursing, trucking, and welding
- Entered employment rate usually well over 80%, average yearly wages over \$30,000 per year, retention rates over 90%
- 179 job placements this fiscal year, with pace improving to roughly 40 placements a month
- Work provided by a contractor, ResCare

**MISC System**

The S.I. System is used to describe the units are based on factors of ten.

For example, the standard unit of length in the S.I. System are the millimeter, which equals 1/1000 meter, the centimeter, which equals 1/100 meter, the meter, which is the base unit, and the kilometer, which equals 1000 meters.

**Metric System**

1 millimeter = 1/1000 meter  
1 centimeter = 1/100 meter  
1 meter = 1000 millimeters

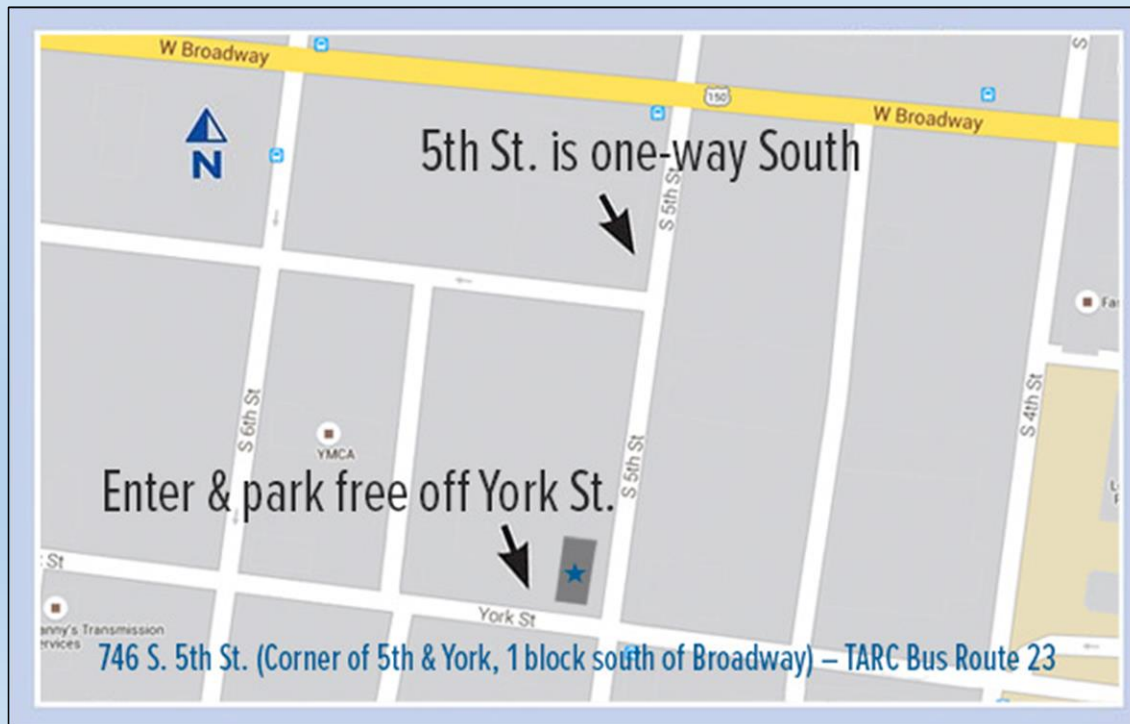

- 220 front-end web development graduates since May 2015
- 44 back-end development graduates, 15 mobile graduates
