





Good morning Mr. Hines!

We spoke yesterday regarding Honorary Street Signs. The funds requested will be directed to Public Works & Assets, Signs & Markings for costs associated with the making of and installation of 3 Honorary Street Signs at the cost of \$188 each, or \$564. The primary sponsor is Councilwoman Donna Purvis, Metro Council District 5.

1. One (1) sign is in honor of Mr. Jerry Brinson and is to be installed on the north side of Montgomery Street at the corner of 25<sup>th</sup> & Montgomery in the Portland neighborhood (from 2400 to 2500 Montgomery is the honorary area). The sign is to read "Jerry Brinson Way." The cost for the sign/installation is \$188.00.
2. Two (2) signs in honor of the local alumni chapter of Omega Psi Phi are to be installed in the Russell neighborhood on the south side of Chestnut Street at the corner of 24<sup>th</sup> Street and then 26<sup>th</sup> Street. The signs are to read in two lines "Theta Omega Way, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc." The cost for the sign/installation is \$188 x 2 or \$376.00.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. is an organization of college-educated men dedicated to leadership, scholarship for young students and community service. Locally, members of the Louisville Chapter and our non-profit entity Theta Omega Inc., adhere to that mission and members proudly exemplify excellence in the Louisville community by serving in leadership roles throughout Louisville in education, business, government and healthcare. In regards to community service, our members are regularly lauded as perhaps one of the most active non-profit entities in the area. Most recently, our Chapter partnered with city officials to purchase a historic building in an impoverished neighborhood by committing to restore the building as a beacon of hope for neighboring citizens.

The Men of Quality Lifestyle Choices Forum is our annual student leadership conference that allows us to convene over 600 young male students. In celebration of our 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Men of Quality and the Lifestyle Choices Forum, this year we are expanding the conference by adding a day specifically for elementary males.
