Hi Bill and Kyle –

Attached are the most recent renderings for the skate spot, and the shade structure. I am having Hunger incorporate the shade structure in their renderings, for fundraising purposes, but we plan to locate it on the Payne Street side of the bathrooms, where anyone sitting there can see the swings, sprayground, playground and skate spot, and where it will be visible from Payne Street, as another cool addition to the park.

We are still working on how the skate spot will incorporate with the walking path, but are not crazy about this latest iteration, so don't pay any attention to that. You will see a bright green object now...it's a shamrock, as a shout out to Irish Hill! :0)

We hope to have a final fundraising packet together by next week and will share when we do. So far, we have not been ready for any introductions, so no worries there, but will let you know when we need the cyber-intro to Kelly Lawrence, Kentucky Financial Group and Headliners.

We are using the following language in the documents and are creating a "logo" for the project.

The Louisville Parks Foundation is taking Breslin Park up a notch! With the addition of the Midwest's First Skate Spot, and a super-cool Shade Structure, Breslin Park is getting a fabulous new upgrade."

Just wanted to keep you in the loop. Let me know if you need anything else from me before you can make a determination about what you can contribute to the project. The total cost is now \$106,000 including the shade structure. There may be some additional costs, based on the final plan to reroute those two sections of the walking path.
