He stated that Louisville has moved back into the Red Zone since the Council's last meeting. He also stated that 1,585,980 COVID vaccine doses have been received in Jefferson County, and that everyone should continue to encouraged others to get vaccinated as we go into the Holiday season with a new variant emerging.

Council President James also spoke about fellow Kentuckians affected by the tornado and the 74 who lost their lives, including 12 children. He encouraged participation in the many donation drives being organized.
