- In the past year, Clean Activites has conducted 327 clean-ups
- Clean and Sip is a new event in downtown Louisville
- Brightside Foundation has committed \$54,000 to update signage and re-do the Brightside sites in time for Derby

- Rob Lush and the Clean Collaborative Crew have partnered with Brightside to keep areas clean

- In Paint the Town Yellow, businesses will install yellow filters on their lights
- Questions about the Adopt a Mile Program
- District 21 Tree Planting Project in partnership with Louisville Grows
- Questions about whether Brightside has an award program to recognize
- community members who work hard in keeping the community clean
- Bightside Louisville Clean Events start March 13th at Noble Funk

- Whether there is a projected savings amount for the next two years
- Question about the number of electric vehicles, equipment, and trucks have been added to the fleet
