


## Change in Population by County: 2000 to 2010






Components of Kentucky Population Change, 2010-2014








Total Migration






## Students Qualifying for Free and Reduced Lunch, 2012-2013










Asian Alone, Not Hispanic or Latino








White Alone, Not Hispanic or Latino
