1,500 Children, each year, live in a home where police are not called but a parent files a petition for an emergency protection order due to domestic violence









Three-Tiered Approach for Behavioral/Mental Health Support





What is Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA)?





- Youth Mental Health First Aid is the help offered to a young person experiencing a mental health challenge, mental disorder, or a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate help is received or until the crisis resolves.
- Research-based and on the national list of effective programs
- A cadres of 10 JCPS staff certified as YMHFA trainers
- We have trained 195 JCPS staff
- Training is available to both certified staff and classified staff


